Death of Mrs. Siver.

Mrs. Siver, an esteemed resident of Richmond Hill for more than 60 years, passed away peacefully at the residence of her daughter, Mrs. W. A. Suddaby, Saturday last, only a few days short of 98 years. Deceased was born in England, and came to Canada when 11 years of age. For many years the family conducted a boot and shoe business in the village, the husband predeceasing his widow by about 33 years. Interment in the family plot Tuesday after a short service at the home conducted by her pastor, Rev. J. Aikenhead, and Rev. N. Wellwood.

St. Stephen's Church, Maple

The second annual social of the Church of England Sunday school and congregation in Maple was held in the Masonic hall on the evening of Friday, December 22nd. In spite of the inclemency of the weather early in the day, it became almost ideal in the late afternoon, and the attendance was good especially among the little folk.

A Christmas tree with all its trappings decorated one corner of the hall. The ladies of the church provided a bountiful supply of good things to eat, and everyone present demonstrated their appreciation of it.

As soon as the tables were cleared and moved aside, Rev. P. W. Richardson gave a very impressive address on the importance of the Sunday school in moulding moral character and the future congregation of a church and community. He expressed the deep regret of all present at the unavoidable absence of Miss E. J. Wilson, to whom the Sunday school of St. Stephen's church owed so much.

An impromptu programme was then given by the children, in which they crowned themselves with laurels and gave great pleasure to their audience. The chief event of the evening was the awarding of prizes for attendance at Sunday school from Advent 1915 to Advent 1916. For this wall-cards were given. These varied in size and style to a certain extent according to the record of the scholar. Last October, Little's Cross and Crown system of rewards was adopted by the whole school. The first quarterly period having just elapsed, the present occasion was used for the exchange of buttons. The rector pinned on the children, having the eligible number of attendances, the bronze buttons No. 1, while the celluloid buttons No. 0 were returned to Geo. P. Bosanquet, the Sunday school superintendent.

The evening's pleasure was slightly marred by the non-arrival of gift books for the Sunday school children, but these will reach those they were intended for.

A very social evening ended with fire crackers, good wishes for Christmas, God save the King, and in most cases, a drive home with pockets full of candy and oranges.
