UNIONVILLE

At a meeting of the Executive Committee of the Markham Township Sunday School Association, held in Unionville immediately after the Annual Convention of the Association held at Victoria Square on Jan. 18 and 19, it was unanimously decided to follow up the work of the convention by some definite plan, applicable to the whole township, to stimulate Sunday School work and the study of God's word in the home.

It was resolved that the hearty cooperation of all the Ministers, Sunday School Superintendents and workers with the members of the Executive Committee should be obtained, consequently it was decided to call a meeting of all such on March 10th in the Methodist Church, Unionville. That meeting was well attended, nineteen schools being represented.
