Elia Horse Breeders

A good representation of farmers was out to the first meeting of The Elia Horse Breeder's Association, on Friday evening in Elia Forester's Hall.

The president, Mr. Jno. Jackson, was in the chair and opened the meeting by a short address, after which he called on Mr. J. C. Steckley to explain some matters of importance. It seems Mr. Steckley has lately been at a convention at Guelph, where the scheme was treated most exhaustively by the Live Stock Commissioner, and so he was able to give us the last word in information about it. Some amendments have been made to the rules laid down in the booklet. The most notable is in rule, No. 6, of the outline which states one-third of the service fee for each guaranteed mare shall be paid by the Club to the stallion owner at the end of the service season. Of course the Live Stock Branch pays 40% of that back to the Club. The amendment states that in case the mare does not prove to be in foal that one-third is paid back to the mare-owner. It was also inferred that the rules and regulations of the scheme would require some adjustment (at the suggestions of farmers) before the work would progress most efficiently.

It was carried on motion that the membership fee be \$1 per mare, and should that fee not cover the expenses of the secretary, the club would make up the deficiency.

Messrs. Carl James and Charles Snider were appointed a committee to interview Mr. David Howard to make arrangements as to service fees etc.

Moved by J. H. Snider, seconded by W. Snider that the secretary be paid 20c. per hour for services rendered.—Carried.
