

VAUGHAN COUNCIL

The above Council met as a Court of Revision on Monday, June 4th at 10 o'clock a.m. of the Assessment Rolls of the Township for the year 1917.

Henry Smith, Maple, appealed to have bitch struck from Roll and Messrs. Frank Finley, Andrew Stewart, Maurice Evans, Hunter Bros. and George Miller to have dogs struck off, all were allowed.

Mr. George Daniel, Richmond Hill, appealed against assessment, court lowered same \$200.00, Lot 43, Con. 1.

Miss Mabel Gray, Teacher S. S. No. 18, appealed against her income assessment having paid taxes of her predecessor in 1916. The Clerk was instructed to exempt her for the year 1917.

The Toronto Suburban Railway Co. also appealed but not being present, the assessment was confirmed.

Their being no further appeals the Assessment Rolls were confirmed by the Court for the year 1917.

Council met for general business at one o'clock p.m. Minutes of last meeting were read and confirmed.

A sheep claim was presented by Mr. James Downey for 1 ewe and 2 lambs killed by dogs.

Saigeon-Weldrick-That from and after this date, 25 cents per hour be paid for laborers, and 15 cents per yard be paid for gravel. Carried.

Saigeon-McDonald-That the Clerk be instructed to write Mr. T. J. Lynch of the Grand Trunk Railway Co. with reference to having roadway opened West of the G. T. R. tracks at Maple. Council having graded the street leading up to the same, and by so doing will be much safer for the public in general. Carried.

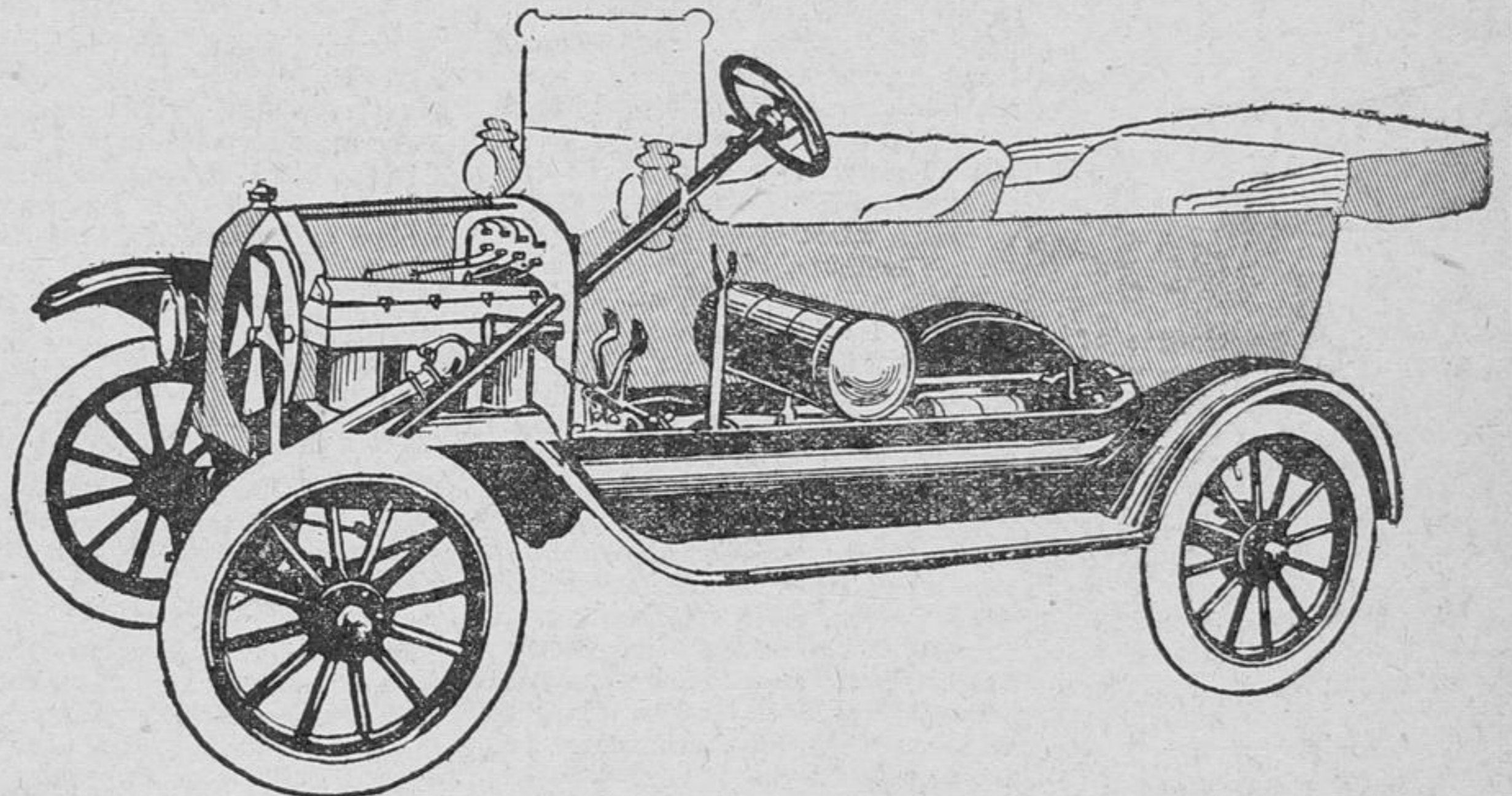
