In this letter he mentions receiving parcel sent by Richmond Hill Auxiliary through the Canadian Red Cross Society. The fact that our Auxiliary has received cards from two prisoners of war, acknowledging parcels sent through the Canadian Red Cross Society, goes to prove that the Society is doing splendid work.

Conscription in England

The Canadian Magazine for October contains an article that is of peculiar interest to Canadians just now, as it reviews the working out of conscription in England. It is entitled "Getting the Men," and is by Lacey Amy, a Canadian writer who has been for two years in England studying wartime conditions there. One comes to the conclusion that if what Mr. Amy says is true regarding the ease with which exemption is obtained in England the same ease will not be experienced in Canada. Mr. Amy says that over there men are exempted on any one of many trivial excuses, and that, for example, a commission will exempt a man who owes him a debt, because if the man should go to the war the debt might never be paid.

Metropolitan Railway

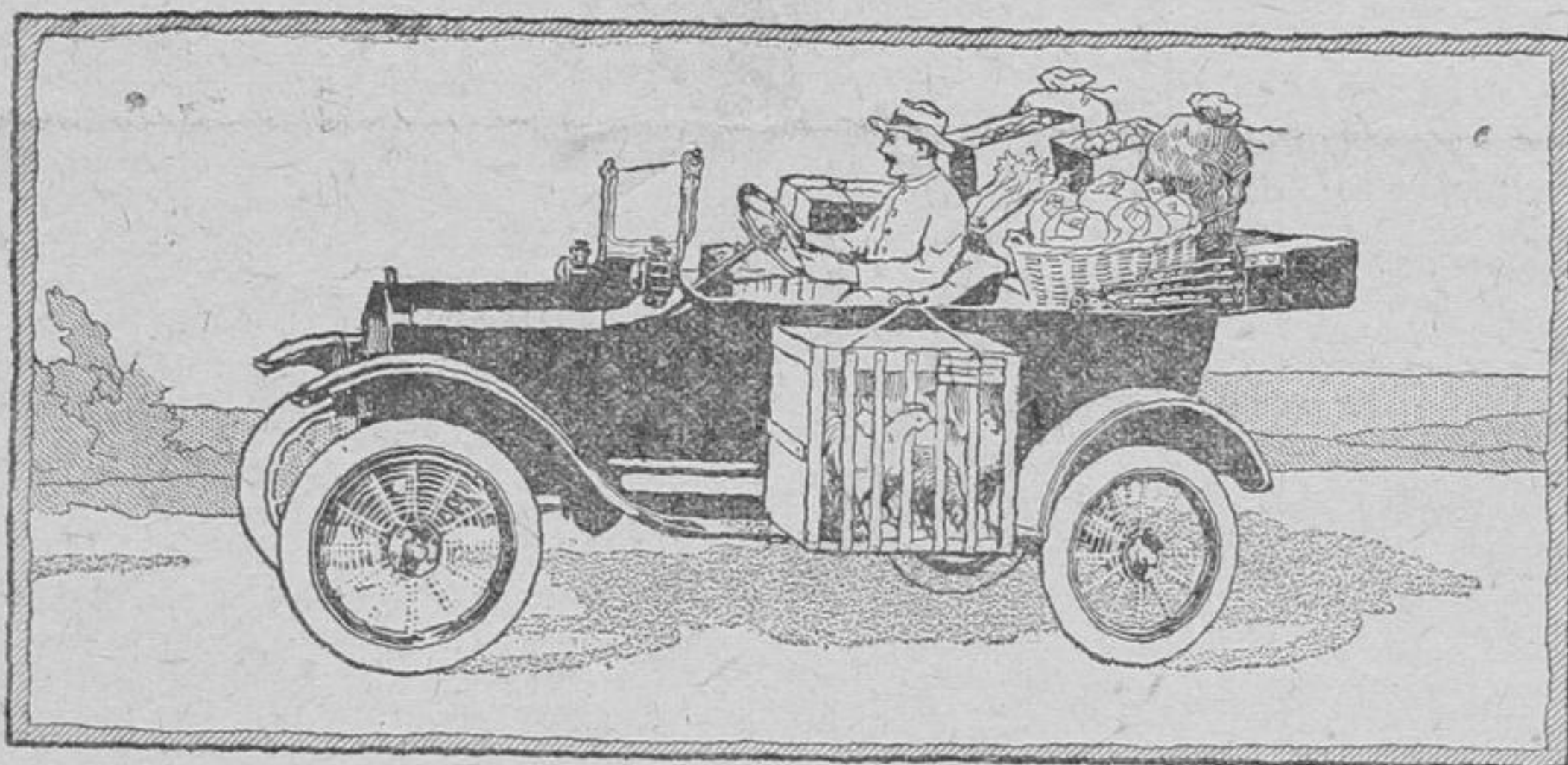
