

RICHMOND HILL, ONT., Nov. 22, 1917

His Excellency the Governor General in Council, under and by virtue of the provisions of the War Measures Act, 1914, is pleased to make the following regulations and the same are hereby made and enacted accordingly:—

1. On and after the first day of December, 1917, and until the Governor General in Council has by Order declared that the present abnormal

conditions have ceased, no grain of any kind and no substance that can be used for food shall be used in Canada for the distillation of potable liquors.

2. Any person violating the above regulation shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding five thousand dollars, or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months, or to both fine and imprisonment.

Largely-signed petitions and nomination papers have been presented urging me to this decision. I am delighted to act on the requests that have come to me through these expressions of confidence and through other sources.

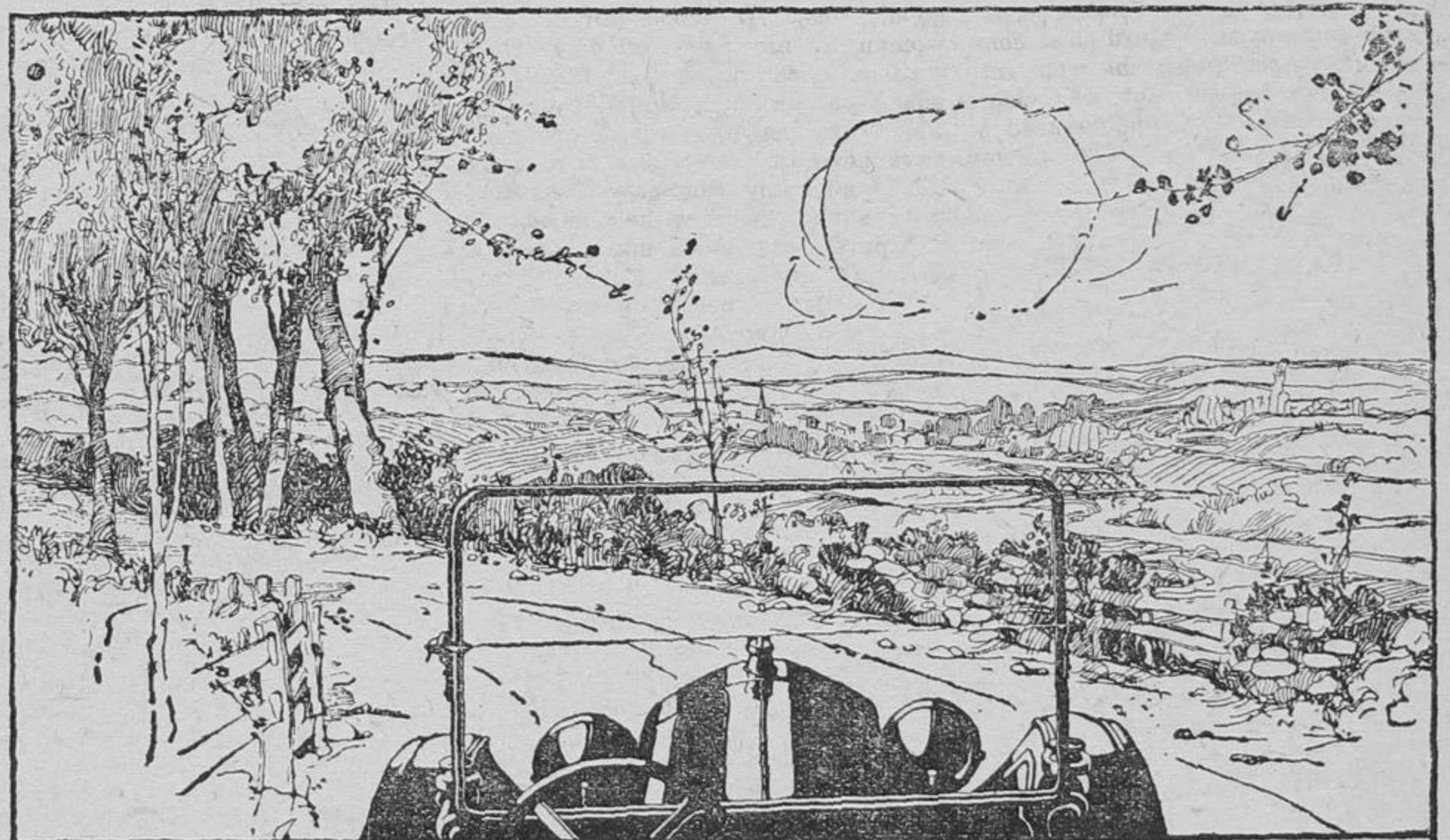
