Gains Double Honor

A Langstaff boy who has won his commission on the field is Lieut. Robt. E. Richards, formerly of Langstaff, now of 4, Vancouver ave., Toronto. Only recently he has been mentioned in despatches as follows—"Lieut. R. E. Richards established a new position, held it twenty four hours resoundingly wounded three times. He was promoted to lieutenant and also won the D. C. M. with his promotion for this bravery". He is 27 years of age and was born at the old toll-gate Langstaff, and worked for some time at carpentering before going overseas in August, 1916.

Lieut. R. E. Richards has two brothers serving also. Driver Ernest of the A. S. C., who has been overseas since December 1915, and Pte. Chas. of the Canadian Forestry Corps now in France went overseas last summer.

Canada And The War.

Mr. John S. Ewart of Ottawa, a strenuous critic of imperialism and author of "Kingdom Papers", contributes to The Canadian Magazine for April a very subtle article showing that Canada's part in the war, taken freely and at her own instance, is a tendency towards independence. He cites former occasion when Canada, both as a Province and as a Dominion, sent aid to the Mother Country, but on such an occasion, he points out, the aid was sent, not as a duty, but with sympathy, and he adds that it always involved a strengthening of the independent spirit in Canada. The article should be read by Imperialists as well as by those who are opposed to Imperialism.

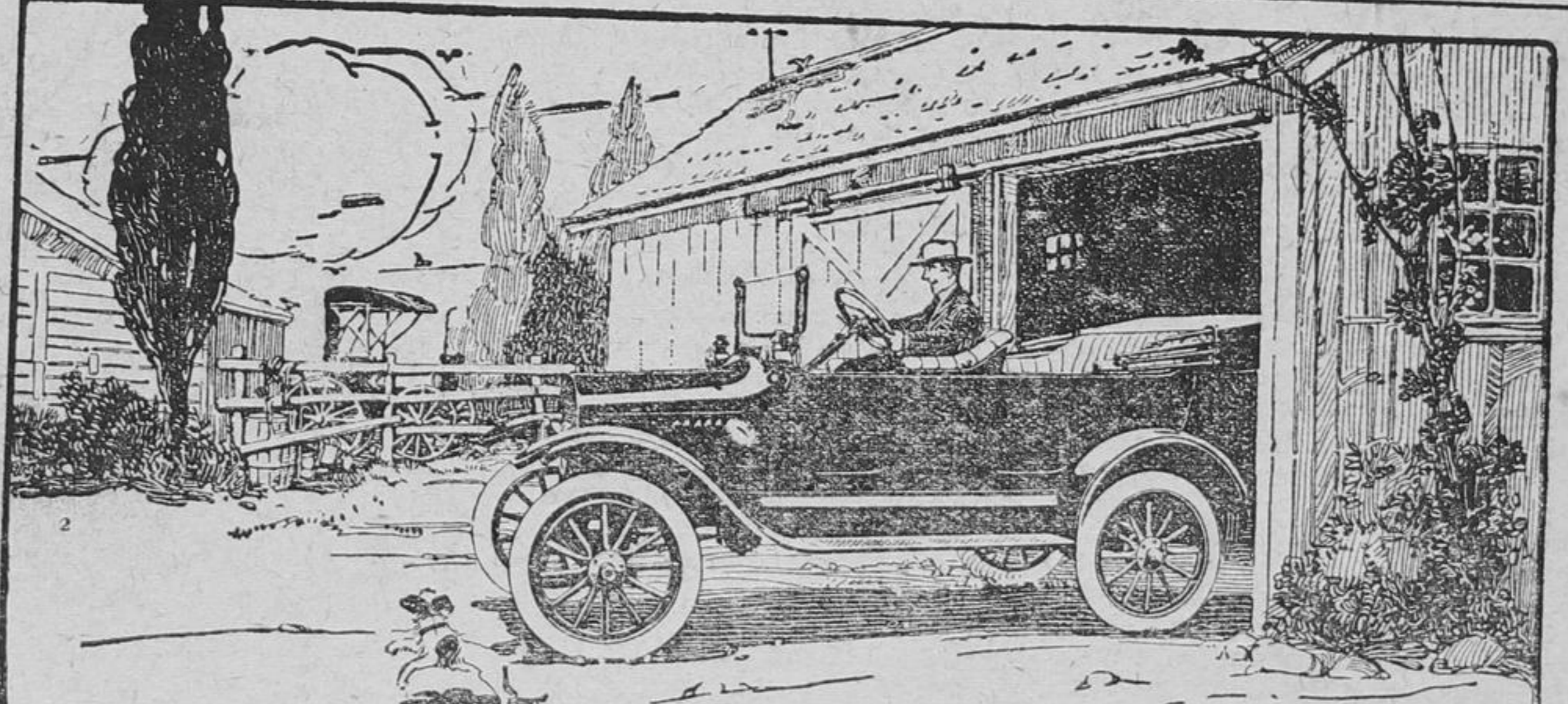
