

LET MAGISTRATES SETTLE. One often hears an expression like the following:- 'If I find a person in my orchard or in my berry patch I will shoot him." There does not seem to be a law to prevent men from firing at people, but there is a law to punish men for their folly

Two cases recently occurred in this section. A few weeks ago James McNaughton, over seventy years of age, highly respected in the township of Vaughan, shot Forest Bishop in the leg because the latter and another young man would not move from opposite his residence in pitching quoits. There is little doubt the young men had provoked the old gentleman, but that did not justify him in taking the law into his own hands. For his folly Mr. McNaugh ton has paid Bishop \$1200 and he has to spend two months on the Industrial Farm.

The other case was at Newton Brook where trespassers were fired upon by the owner of a berry patch, one of the trespassers being wounded. The owner has been found guilty, and will receive his sentence to-day. Cases like the above should be settled by judges or magistrates-not by individuals.

THE PREMIER SHOULD BE HOME.

"What everybody is saying must be true." With few exceptions it is the general opinion that Sir Robert Borden and other members of the ministry, who are now in London, could be better employed in Canada where a crisis may develop at any moment. A daily newspaper on Tuesday announced that postmen were on strike in Toronto, Victoria, Vancouver, New Westminster and Winnipeg. The validity of the Military Service Act has been questioned, and knotty questions are continually cropping up, yet our Premier seems to think it more important to be at Lloyd George's elbow in time of war.

TOO LENIENT.

Judge Morson, a few days ago, sentenced Frank Sylvester to six months in addition to his unexpired term of two years, for escaping from the Jail farm. County Crown Attorney Greer gave it as his opinion that it was a serious thing allowing prisoners so much freedom. The opinion is general that prisoners at the juil farm are treated more like guests than criminals. And it is safe to say the prisoners do not appreciate the kindness and forbearance shown them.

York County Council at its last sitting adopted the principle of raising money for the British Red Cross this year by a tax rate of 3 of a mill on the dollar over the whole county, which will give \$45000. It was shown that some individuals and some municipalities have in past years been giving more than their share, and some much less. By an equalized tax rate the rich man pays in proportion to his wealth, and the poor man also pays his proper share.
