Seed Importation Regulations.

Canadian farmers and gardeners are grasses, vetches, rape, other forage of the same. plants, field root and garden vegetables in lots of ten pounds or more.

In Pamphlet S-12 of the Seed Branch of the Department of Agriculture at Ottawa, and obtainal le from the Publications Bran h unfit seed is described as that which does not comply with rink on Friday, February 14. Special the Seed Control Act requirements prizes will be offered. Watch for respecting the sale of seed in Canada, further announcement next week. or if it has been refused admittance any other country on account of low vitality.

The regulations will be carried out through the Custom's officials who are required to take and forward to the Dominion Seed Laboratory for examination, sample of lots of seeds of the classes named entered for consumption in Canada. Seed that has arrived in Canada and found to be unfit shall be deported under Customs supervision. The penalty for failing to comply with regulations is \$500, for the first offense and not exceeding \$1,000 for the second and each subsequent offense.
