Rain Saturday evening very much interfered with the garden party prepared for the returned soldiers of that district, by the York Branch of the Red Cross Society. Tables for the refreshments had been set in the open air, but these had to be hurriedly taken under a large tent. Most of the sports had to be cancelled, but an interesting programme was given under cover. Mr. W. F. Maclean, M. P., acted as chairman, and short addresses were given by Mrs. L. A. Catto, Mr. G. S. Henry, M. P. P. The women in charge of the affair were Mrs. L. A. Catto, president; Mrs. H. W. Sleight, 1st vice-president; Mrs. M. Holley, secretary; Mrs. J. Bales, 2nd vice-president; Mrs. W. R. Proctor and Miss R. Bathgate, treasurer.

NEWS NOTES
Mr. J. E. Seagram, a noted horse-breeder and distiller died at Waterloo on Monday. He was an ex-M.P.
Mr. Henry Ford, one of the largest employers of labor in the world, was branded as an anarchist by the Chicago Tribune. A jury has decided that Mr. Ford was libelled, and the Judge awarded a nominal verdict of 6 cents.
Mr. P. L. Brackin of Chatham has been nominated by the Liberals of West Kent for the next election for the Ontario Legislature. Mr. H. H. Dewar, K.C., Leader of the Opposition, was present and delivered an address.

A memorial service in memory of Bro. Capt. Fryatt, who was murdered by the Huns, will be held by the Ancient Order of Foresters, in Massey Hall, Toronto, Sunday evening, August 31st, Chair taken at 7 o'clock. The 48th Highlanders Band will furnish selections appropriate to the occasion, and a special musical programme will be provided. Everyone will be welcome.
Hon. Justice W. E. Middleton, of the Ontario Supreme Court, and Hon. Joseph A. Chisholm, of the Supreme Court of Nova Scotia, it is officially announced, have been named by the Dominion Government, a Royal Commission to probe charges made by the Rev. Kennedy H. Palmer, of Guelph, Ont., and any other specific charges in regard to the Guelph Novitiate. The trouble over the Novitiate, it will be recalled, arose when Capt. A. C. MacAuley, on the night of June 7, 1917, visited the institution for the purpose of ascertaining whether or not any of its inmates were evading military service.

Sheep and Goat Directory.
The sheep and goat industry in Canada continues to grow, not only on account of the money to be made from mutton and wool, but the fact that goats are considered to be immune from tuberculosis has been the great factor in the encouragement of milch goat raising in a number of the provinces of Canada. Pamphlet No. 17, a directory of Breeders of Pure Bred Sheep and Goats in the Dominion of Canada, issued by the Sheep and Goat Division of the Live Stock Branch and procurable, free upon application, from the Publications Branch, Ottawa, gives the names and addresses of breeders of recognized breeds of sheep and goats in all parts of Canada. Ontario leads in the number of breeders of pure bred sheep while goat breeders are more numerous in British Columbia where the milch goat industry is assuming fairly large proportions.
