#### VAUGHAN COUNCIL

Vaughan Township Council met at the Town Hall, Vellore, on Monday, Nov. 3.

Members present—Reeve Whitmore, Dept. Reeve Anderson, and Councilors Kellam and McDonald.

Minutes of last meeting read and confirmed.

A petition was read and laid on the table from Mr. David Moyle and 46 others residing on Yonge street, asking for Hydro Electric Light and Power.

McDonald—Anderson: That the Clerk be instructed to take the necessary legal proceedings for obtaining said estimate.

Kellam—McDonald: That the Clerk be instructed to write Mr. E. A. James, Engineer for the County of York Highway Commission, advising him of the deplorable condition of the gravel road north of the Village of Kleinburg, and requesting immediate action in having the said road properly repaired.

A number of general accounts and road accounts were ordered paid.

Council adjourned to meet at the Town Hall, Vellore, Monday, Dec. 1, at 10 a.m.

#### Moving Pictures

Mr. Mockford, representative for the Victory Loan in West York, held a meeting in the Masonic Hall here Tuesday evening. He gave good reasons why people with money should invest it in Victory Bonds. #### Coroner's Inquest

An inquest was held in the Council Chamber on the evening of the 5th of November, following the death of a young child which had been left in the care of Mrs. Fulkerson. Dr. Wesley of Newmarket was coroner. Dr. Penland stated that the child had died of pneumonia. Mrs. Fulkerson was also examined. The child had only been in her care a day or two when it was taken ill. The jury found that death was from natural causes, and that no blame whatever was attached to the woman in charge. All evidence went to show that the young children left in Mrs. Fulkerson's care are well taken care of, and that the house and surroundings are satisfactory in every way.

#### Board of Health

The Board of Health met on the 10th of November in the Clerk's office, all the members being present.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

The Medical Health Officer stated that, owing to the danger of an epidemic of small pox, which is at present prevalent in Toronto and other neighboring municipalities, he advocated the immediate and compulsory vaccination of all children in the village.

Moved by Mr. Reaman, seconded by the Secretary, that the Medical Health Officer be and he is hereby instructed to proceed as in his judgment the situation demands.—Carried.

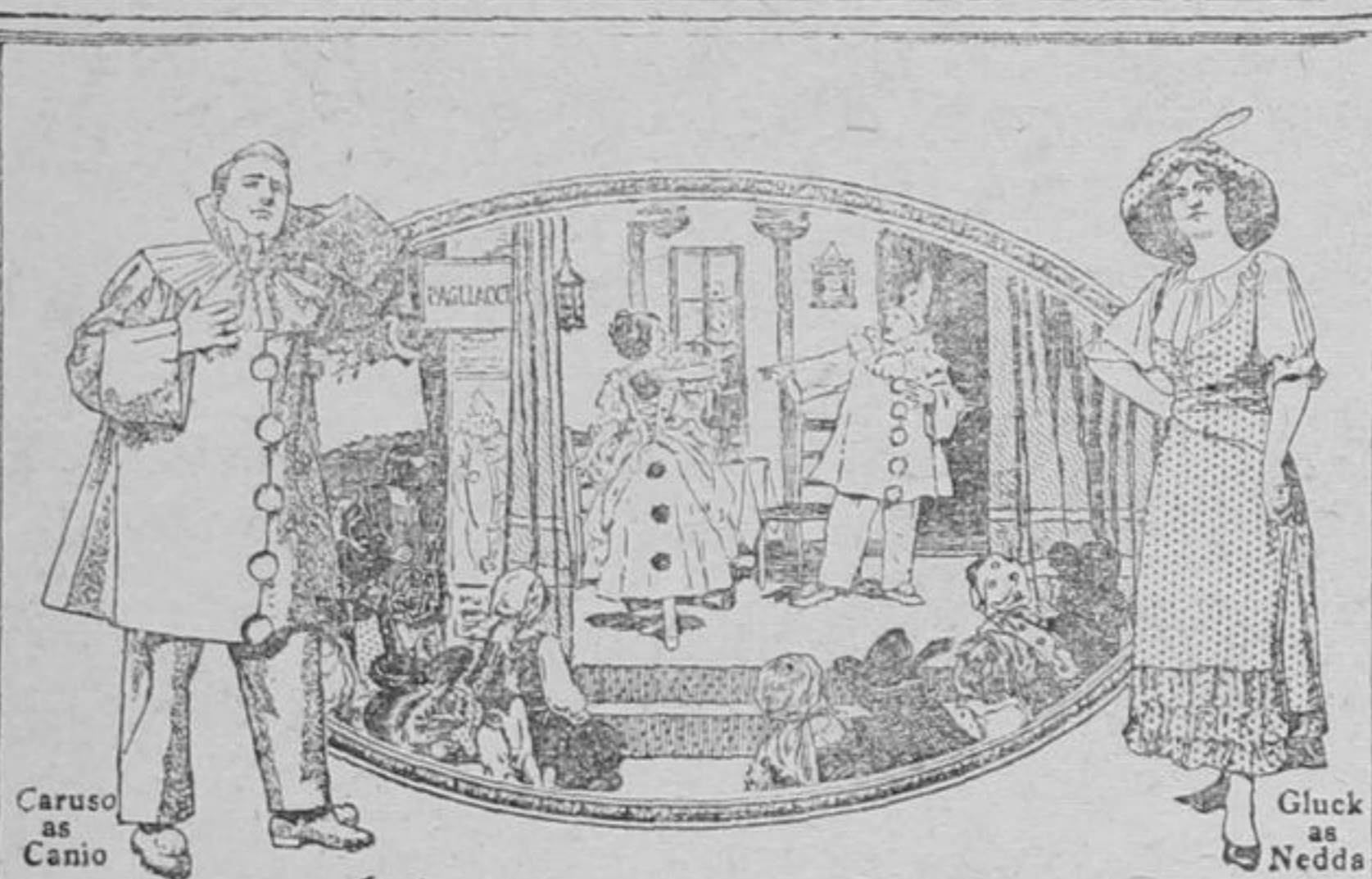
