Village Council

The Council held its inaugural meet-
ing, pursuant to statute, at eleven
o'clock a.m., on January 12th, in the
Council Chamber, present the Reeve
and Councillors Monkman and Greene,
who made and subscribed their res-
pective declarations of qualification
and of office, after which the Council
adjourned to meet in the clerk's office
on Thursday January 15th.

The Council met on January 15, in
the clerk's office with all the members
present. The following accounts were
passed and payment of the same or-
dered: Municipal Lighting for Dec.
1919 \$194.53. H. B. Stirling wire and
services \$59.26. Federal Engineering
Co. sundries \$9.22. T. & Y. R. R.
transformer \$211.00.

Mr. Thorpe was present to arrange
for skating for public school pupils. It
was decided to allow public school
pupils the use of the rink on Friday
afternoons from 4 to 5 o'clock at a fee
of one dollar per hour.

On motion the Clerk was instructed
to advertise for tenders for a quantity
of gravel for sidewalk purposes. The
Electric Light Commission were in-
structed to procure a volt meter for
the use of the Electrician in testing
electric current.

Dr. Pentland verbally tendered his
resignation as Medical Health Officer,
which on motion was accepted, and
the Clerk was instructed to write a
letter of thanks for the Doctor's ser-
vices and to express regret that his
resignation was necessary.

Mr. Geo. S. Sims and Mr. Geo.
Cowie were appointed Chief and
Lieutenant respectively of the Fire
Brigade.

By-law No. 293 for borrowing pur-
poses was given its several readings
and passed.

A by-law for the appointment of
officials was given its first and second
readings and several blanks were
filled in. Committee which rose and
reported by-law uncompleted and
asked leave to sit again, permission
granted, and Committee to report at
next meeting of Council.

It was decided to hold a Skating
Carnival on the evening of February
5th next, and Council adjourned.

Anglican Churchmen "Protest"

The Evening Telegram of Saturday
contained an article showing that
strong disapproval was voiced by rep-
resentative Church of England clergy-
men concerning the resolution that
has been circulated by Rev. Ensor
Sharp of St. Thomas Church and Rev.
H. R. Mockridge of St. John's Mis-
sion House, East Toronto, in which it
is said:

"We, as clergy and laity of the
Church of England, feel we must em-
phatically protest against the Church
of England in Canada being classed as
one of 'The Five Protestant Churches'
of Canada in the so-called Inter-Church
Movement. Furthermore, we feel that
we must consistently assert the fact
that the Church of England in Canada
is an integral part of the Catholic
Church, whose faith she has always
confessed."

Archdeacon Cody is said to have dis-
approved of the petition in these
words: "They certainly would not
send the petition to me. They know I
am a Protestant. I did not sign that
petition, nor will I sign it. It seems
to me that an effort is being made at
the last moment to isolate the Church
of England in Canada from the general
Forward Movement now under
way."

"The Church of England is both
Protestant and Catholic. It is Catho-
lic toward all the truths of God; it is
Protestant against all the errors of
man. The word Protestant is not
merely a negation, but expresses testi-
mony on behalf of truth. I deeply de-
plore the action that is taken by this
section of the Church of England at
the present time, and I disclaim all
sympathy with these divisive and iso-
lating movements."

Canon Plumtre is reported as fol-
lows: "I believe that these men, for
whom I have the deepest respect, have
entirely misunderstood the true po-
sition of the Church of England, and
that all her articles and formulae link
her up with the other Protestant
Churches, and not with the Church of
Rome. The greatest hope of my life
for many years has been to draw these
churches closer together."

"I deplore very deeply the raising
of such a question at this crisis of Can-
adian church life when such a vast
body of Canadian Christians are work-
ing in harmony for a great Forward
Movement," said Rev. Dyson Hague
of the Church of the Epiphany.

Several other Church of England
clergymen also expressed similar views
to those above.
