Col. Machin Resigns

Seldom has conversion been brought about in the way that it has come to Lieut.-Col. Machin, Ex M. P. P., President of the Citizens' Liberty League. In resigning the Presidency, he accuses the members of selfishness, saying that as soon as the wealthy members had their cellars full they lost interest in the cause they had formerly championed.

The Col. is not far from the truth when he points out that the present system is class legislation, a system that favors (?) the rich. For instance, a wealthy man breaks the O. T. A., and whether the fine is \$5 or \$500 he does not feel it, whereas a poor man for the same offence is sent to jail because he cannot pay the fine. Col. Machin has, therefore, come to the conclusion that we should have liquor for all classes or total prohibition. Here are quotations from his letter of resignation:

"If we are to be bone-dry let us be in fact bone-dry. . . . Prohibition of the manufacture, importation, or possession of liquor in Ontario is the only way to make the Province bone-dry. . . . Then send anyone who breaks the law to jail—whether

he be millionaire or day laborer."

In saying that some of his fellow-members were actuated by self, Col. Machin should remember that so-called liberty is often nothing more nor less than selfishness in disguise. Men and women who vote to make a province "dry" need not be accused of selfishness. Let us be charitable and say their motive is to remove a temptation to use something they believe to be an injury to many men, their wives and their families.

HARDING—In loving memory of Arthur, who departed this life May 5, 1919.

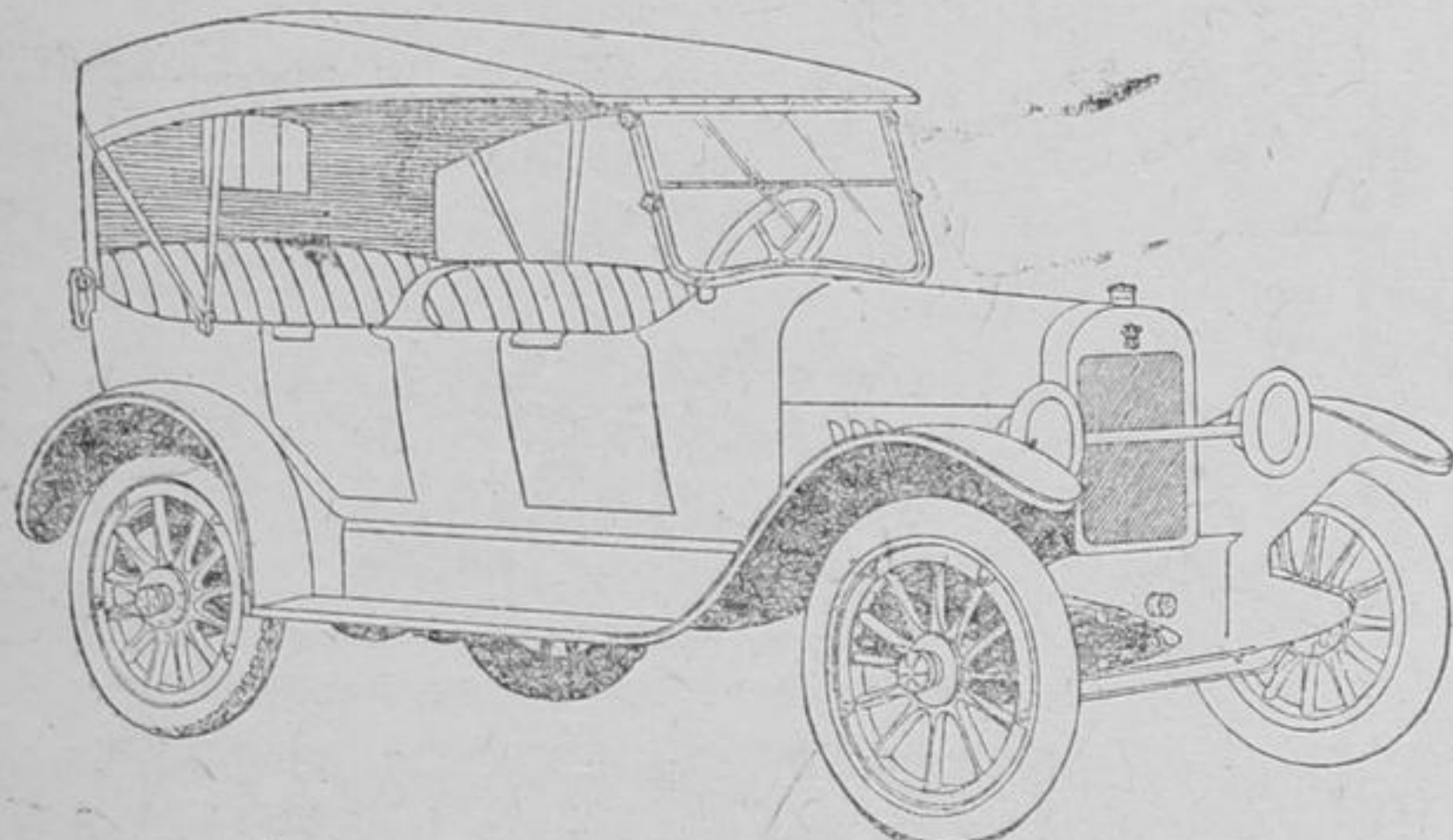
Very oft our thoughts do wander

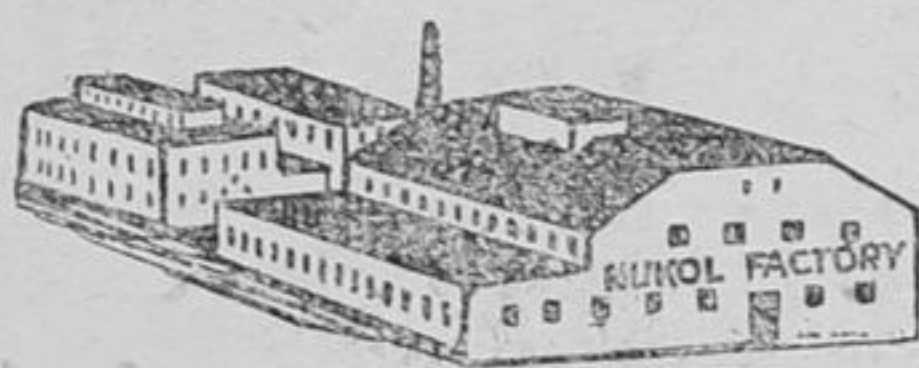

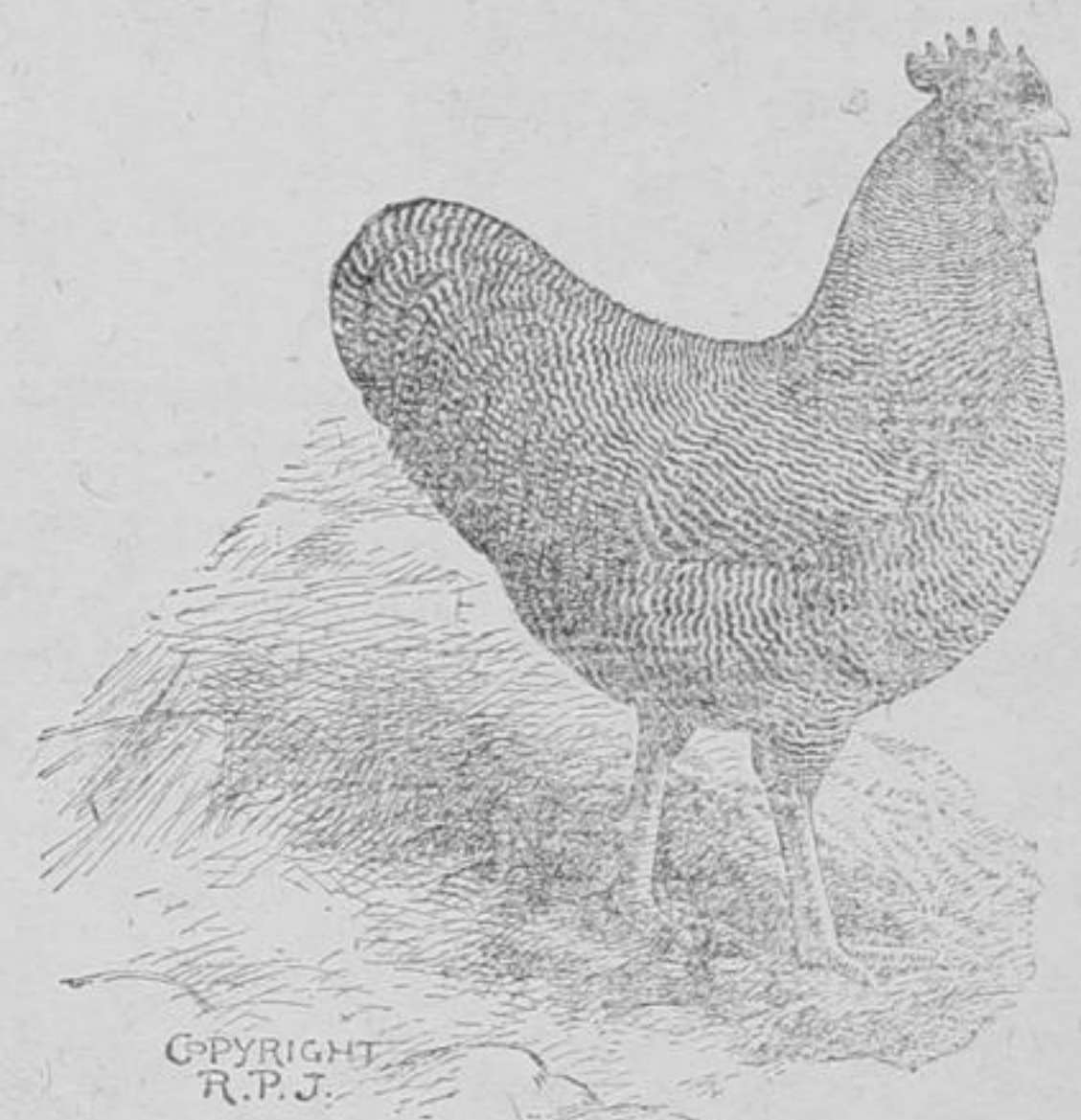

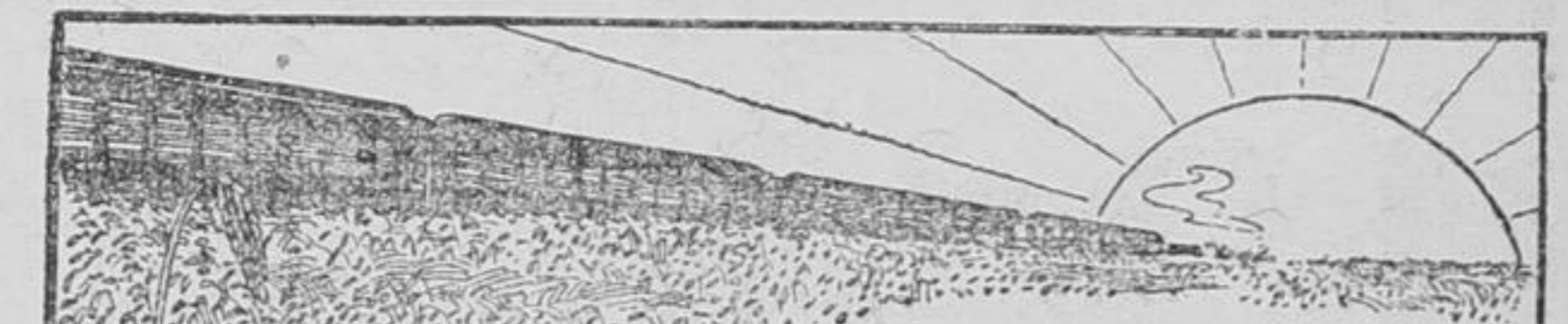
