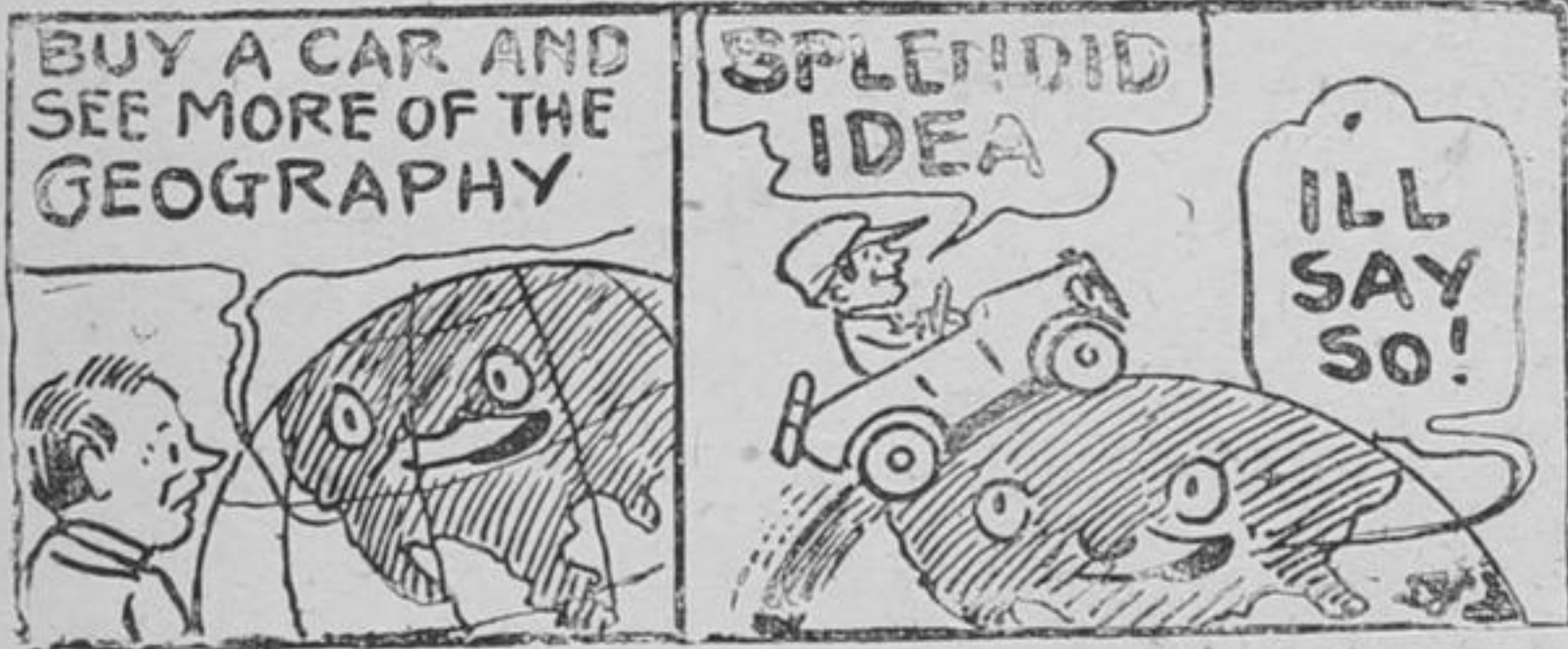
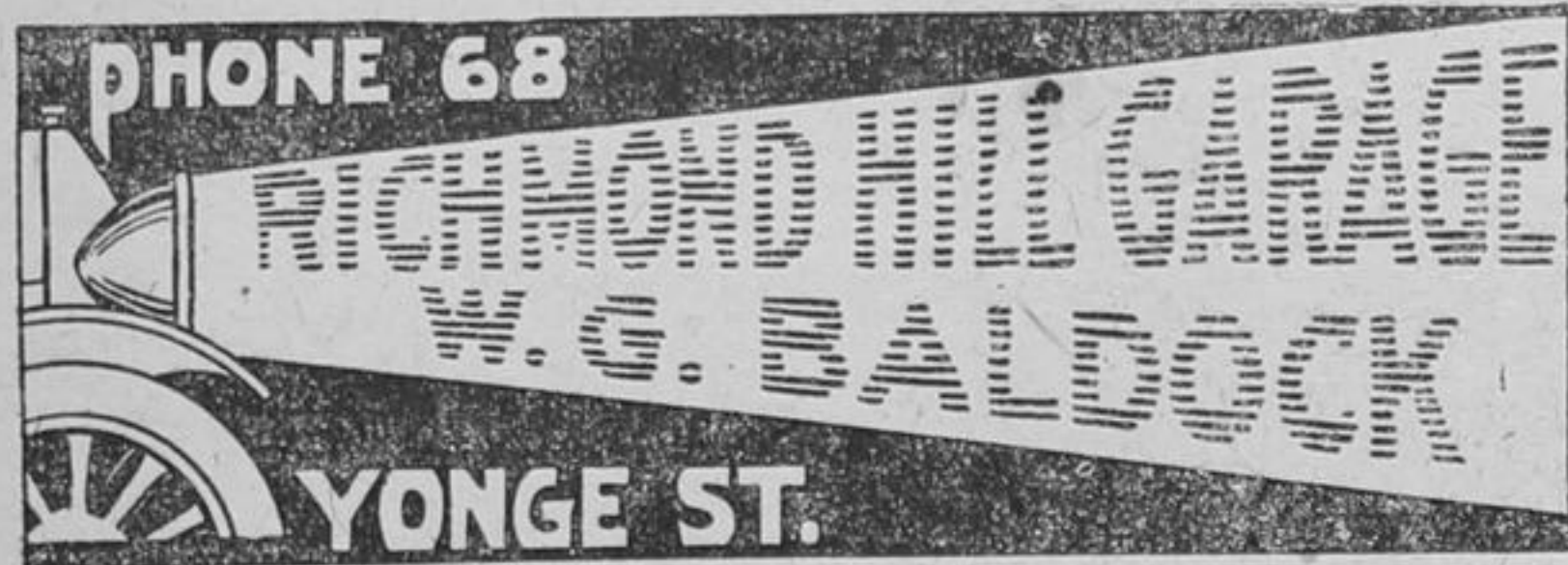

Prof. Wade Toole has contributed to a solution of the problem of whether heavy milkers should be milked twice on three times a day by giving results of tests made at the Ontario Agricultural College. The tests are to be continued and Professor Toole hopes to be able to give a more definite opinion another year than he does at present. In the meantime he shows that three high-class pure-bred cows gave more by twice than by three milking a day. His present conclusions however are the same as those of Professors Barton and Trueman.
