

**Died in the Hospital**

James Lackey of Jefferson who was struck by a motor car Saturday evening of last week, died in St. Michael's Hospital Sunday night. Deceased had been in Richmond Hill on the fatal evening, and went home on a Metropolitan car, getting off at the Jefferson switch. Opposite Mr. Harry Legge's gate he was run down, and was found soon afterwards by Mr. Legge who took him to his home, the old toll-gate house, where he lived with a brother, Dr. Wilson was speedily sent for and the next morning the injured man was sent to the Hospital, but nothing could be done for him. Mr. Lackey was a quiet, unassuming man, and many old friends and neighbors will learn with regret of his untimely death. So far the coward who ran him down has not been found.

**George McCague's Death**

Much sympathy is felt for the wife and family of Mr. George A. McCague of Victoria Square in their sad and sudden bereavement. About three weeks ago while riding the leading horse in helping to take a load up the lane, the chain broke, and struck Mr. McCague on the head. He became restless, and imagined that things were not going right. Everything possible was done for him, but the end came early Friday morning.

Deceased lived on the old homestead and was one of the prominent farmers of the Township. He was a Justice of the Peace, superintendent of the Methodist Sunday School, and a member of the Official Board. He was of an amiable disposition and was highly respected by all who knew him. The funeral on Sunday was very large, many coming from a distance to show their last tribute of esteem. The service was conducted by his pastor, Rev. A. McNeill who in an earnest sermon spoke words of comfort to the sorrowing family. Deceased is survived by his widow, four sons and two daughters.

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**BY-LAW NUMBER . . . .**

To authorize the granting of certain fixed assessments and exemptions with regard to certain properties within the Village of Richmond Hill—

Whereas certain industries have located within the said Municipality and it is expedient that the said industries should be encouraged by the granting of certain privileges and exemptions,

Therefore the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Village of Richmond Hill enacts as follows:

1st. That the Inrig Shoe Company, Limited, be, and it is hereby granted a fixed assessment of \$2,750.00 on the premises owned by the said Company on the East side of Yonge street being known as Lot No. 371 according to a plan of the said Village made by C. Reuben, said fixed Assessment to be for a period of 15 years.

2nd. That Mr. J. H. Dunlop be granted a fixed assessment of \$3,000.00 on the eastern portion of his property, being Lot No. 335 according to said Plan, and consisting of about twenty acres, for a period of 10 years, and also that for the same term of 10 years the glass houses and other buildings used by him in the carrying on of his business as Florist be exempt from Taxation, other than taxes levied for school purposes.

3rd. That for the term of 10 years Harold J. Mills be, and he is hereby granted exemption from taxation, other than for school purposes, upon the glass houses and other buildings used by him in his business as Florist.

4th. That the Bedford Park Floral Company, Limited, be, and it is hereby granted exemption from taxation, other than for school purposes, upon the glass houses and other buildings used by the said Company for the carrying on of its business, the said exemption to be for a period of 15 years.

5th. That this By-law shall come into operation on the day of the final passing thereof.

Read a first and second time and read in Committee this 18th day of November, 1920.

for principal and interest during each of the other years of such period, and Whereas it will require the sum of \$6,901.64 to be raised annually as aforesaid by a special rate on the whole rateable property in the said Village for the paying of the said debt and interest.

Now, therefore the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Village of Richmond Hill enacts as follows:—

1st. That the Reeve of the said Corporation of the Village of Richmond Hill be, and he is hereby authorized to borrow the said sum of ninety-five thousand dollars on the credit of the Corporation for the purposes aforesaid, and to issue Debentures of the said Corporation for the sum of ninety-five thousand dollars payable at the office of the Village Treasurer.

2nd. Within the said period of 30 years there shall be raised and levied annually by a special rate, in addition to all other rates, upon the whole rateable property of the said Village the yearly sum of \$6,901.64 for the payment of the said debt and interest.

3rd. The said Debentures shall all bear the same date and shall be issued within Two Years after the date on which this By-law is passed, and may bear any date within such two years and shall be payable in thirty annual instalments during the thirty years next after the time when the same are issued and the respective amounts of principal and interest payable in each of such years shall be as follows:

4th. The Debentures shall be signed by the Reeve and Treasurer of the said Corporation and shall be sealed with the Corporate seal.

5th. That the source of supply be that herein referred to, or any other source which may be deemed advisable by the Village Council, and approved by the Provincial Board of Health.

6th. This By-law shall come into operation and be of full force and effect on the day of the final passing thereof.

Read a first and second time and read in Committee this 18th day of November, 1920.

**Notice to Leaseholders**

Notice is hereby given to Leaseholders within the Village of Richmond Hill that they are required to file in the office of the Clerk of the Village, at least ten days before the day of polling, a statutory declaration as follows,—That the lease extends for the period of time within which the money is to be raised for the payment of the debt created by this By-law. That the property leased is of sufficient value to entitle the holder to vote at the Municipal election, and that he has covenanted in the Lease to pay all Municipal taxes in respect of the property leased (other than taxes assessed for local improvements.)

The names of leaseholders failing to make the required declaration shall not be placed on the Voters' list for voting on this By-law.
