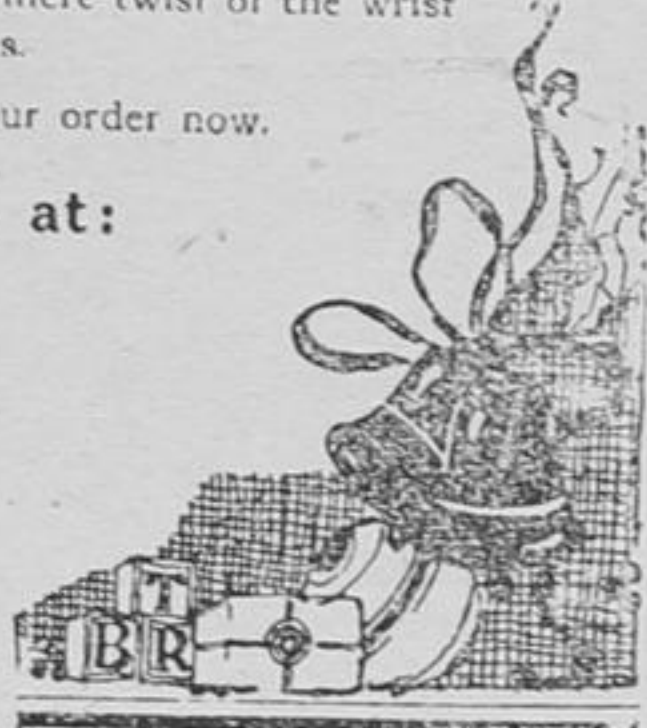

pay roll, and are great acquisitions
to our thriving village.

Remember they are not asking for
a bonus. All that is proposed is to
grant them a low assessment for a
number of years. For the good name
of our village let the vote be as near-
ly unanimous as possible.

Regarding the Water works by-law
while there are those who do not
altogether like the wording or it,
it does not seem safe to vote against
it. With a good water system our
village is sure to grow, and grow
fast. New industries are sure to
come, but some of those already here
complain of the scarcity of water.
The supply at the Wilson pond and
creek is the best in sight. Let us
trust the Council to finish its work,
and pray that a fire may not break
out before our system is completed.
