### Village Council

The Village Council held its inaugural meeting on the 10th, when the following members made and subscribed their declarations of office: T. H. Trench, reeve; D. Hill, J. Monkman, J. Lunan, N. Batty, councillors.

At the adjourned meeting on the 12th inst. a communication from the C. N. R. was read with reference to water supply, to which the clerk was instructed to reply.

An account for printing and stationery was presented and ordered to be paid.

A deputation from the Hockey Club addressed the Council with a view to having the improvements made in the rink. Councillor Monkman was instructed to have the improvements in the rink at an early date.

It was decided that the wage to be paid for ordinary labor be 35c an hour.

Councillor Lunan was instructed to have work carried on in the Topper property in reference to water supply, and to use his discretion as to the carrying on of the work.

Steps were also taken to clean out the pond on the Corporation property on mill street.

Committees were appointed as follows:—

Fire and water—The whole Council with Mr. Lunan as Chairman and Mr. Monkman as Vice-Chairman.

Electric light—Councillors Batty and Hill and Reeve Trench.

Park and buildings—Councillors Monkman and Lunan and Reeve Trench.

Finance and by-laws—Councillors Hill, Batty and Monkman.

Streets and sidewalks—The whole Council with supervisors as follow:—

Ward 1—Councillor Hill.

Ward 2—Councillor Batty.

Ward 3—Councillor Monkman.

Ward 4—Councillor Lunan.

On motion, the clerk was instructed to prepare a by-law to regulate the sale of milk.

### Annual Meeting

The annual meeting of the Richmond Hill Agricultural Society was held last Saturday, Mr. W. Wells, the President in the chair.

The Auditors' report showed a successful year, the balance in the Treasurer's hands being now \$819.12.

The President and each of the directors present gave short addresses, making suggestions as to what might be a benefit for the Annual Fair of 1921.

Before the new officers were elected President Wells expressed the appreciation of officers and members for faithful and untiring efforts of the Secretary-Treasurer on behalf of the Agricultural Society, when it was moved by Mr. McNair and seconded by Mr. McLean, that Mr. H. A. Nicholls be presented with a Silver Flower Stand, the presentation being made by Mr. J. E. Francis.

Mr. Nicholls, who has been Secretary for the last twenty years, though taken altogether by surprise, thanked the donors for the beautiful gift, and looked forward to another successful year.
