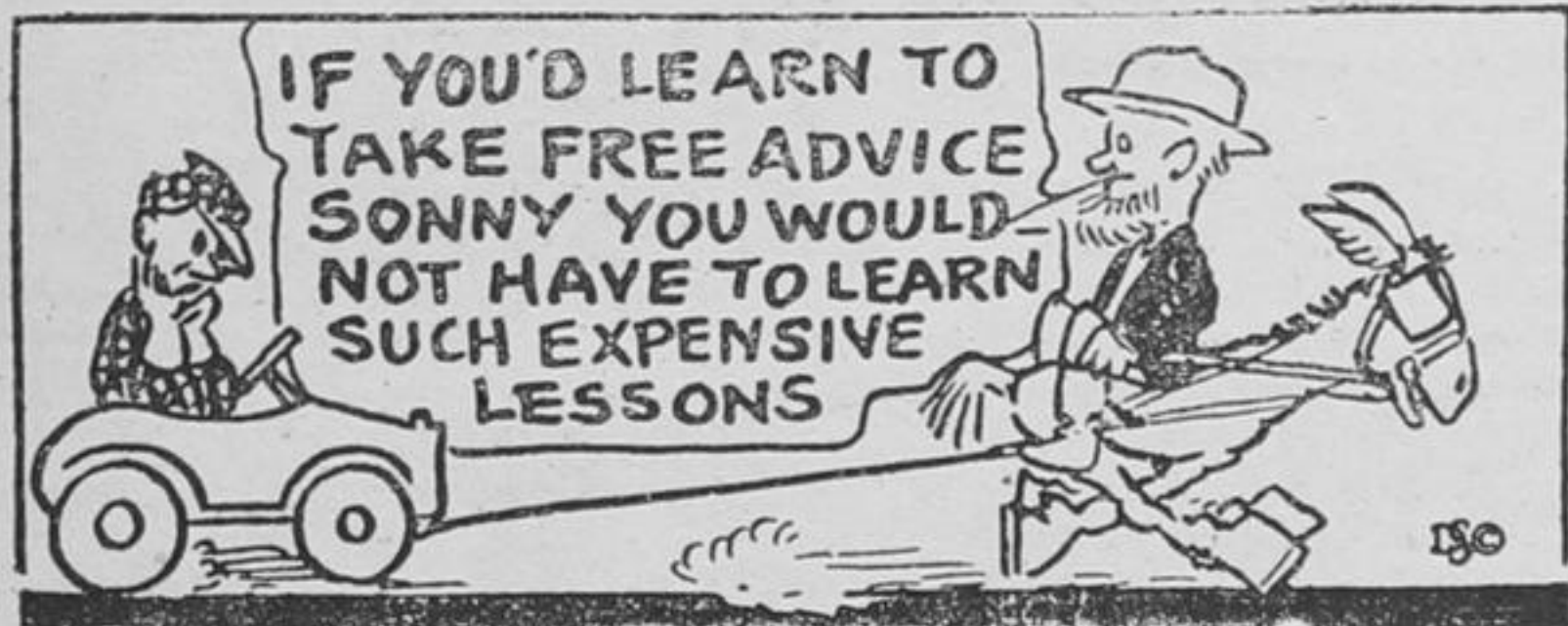
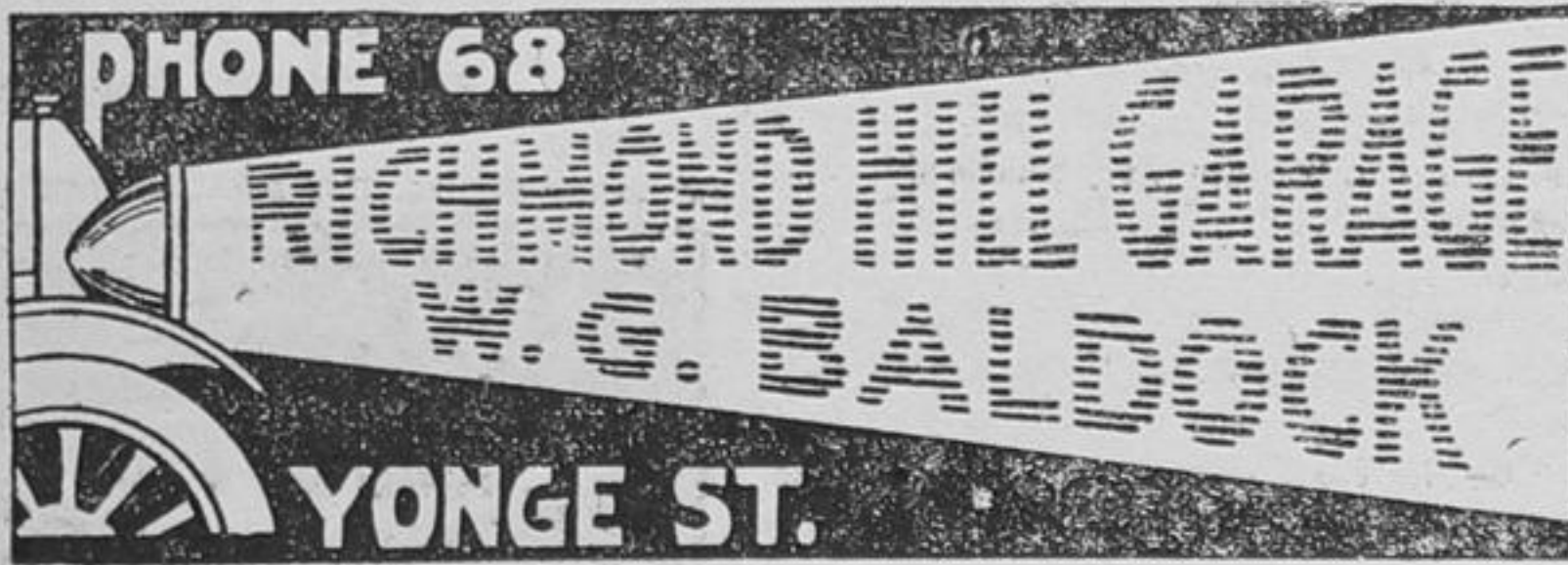

"FLAG AND FLEET"

Col. William Wood is having a hard time in explaining that he meant no insult to the American Nation when he wrote "Flag and Fleet," a book used in the Public Schools as supplementary reading. To say the least, such sentences as the following, reflecting on the honesty of a neighboring nation, do not tend to create a friendly feeling between countries. "The Americans made twelve and a half thousands of millions of dollars out of the war, clear net profit, up to the end of 1918."

That there was profiteering in the United States during the war it cannot be denied. But was there not much profiteering in our own country? Of the latter Col. Wood says not a word in his book.

It is generally conceded that "Flag and Fleet" is well written, and contains much useful information. But parts of it should be revised. Men may feel that our southern neighbors were slow in entering the war. It cannot be denied, however, they greatly assisted in bringing the great conflict to a close. And it will do no good to have our boys and girls taught that the Americans are a nation of profiteers who entered the war for selfish purposes.
