NEWTON BROOK

Children's Week was observed in Newton Brook Community Church from May 2nd to 8th. On Monday evening a meeting of the Teachers and Officers was held when helpful papers were given on "Sunday School Music," "The School and the Home Department" and "Lesson Preparation," followed in each case by thorough discussion. On Tuesday evening a fairly well attended parent-teacher meeting was held and an interesting round table conference was led by the pastor, in which the problems of the school were discussed. On Friday evening a Sunday School Supper was held in which Scholars, Parents and Teachers joined and a very delightful social hour was spent. After Supper a programme was rendered by the various classes of the school and two sets of Lantern slides were shown. The week culminated in observance of Mother's Day on Sunday. The pastor preached to the School at the morning Service and the feature of the evening was a mother's choir. Both services were largely attended.

THORNHILL

Children's Week in the Sunday schools of Ontario has now become a regular institution and with the experience of 1920 before them the Thornhill schools decided this year to make it an even greater success.

On Friday evening preceding the week a union meeting of the workers of the three Sunday schools was held, at which a very enthusiastic address was given by Miss M. Eddie of Cowan Ave. Pres. Church, Toronto, who is also General Secretary of the Toronto Graded Union. This discourse gave much inspiration to the work for the following week.

The teachers made it a point to visit the homes of all their scholars thus bringing the parents in closer harmony with those who teach their children on Sunday.

A pleasant social time was held by the Presbyterian S. S. on Friday evening when supper was served to the parents of the children by the officers and teachers, and full justice was done to the good things provided, after which the pastor, Rev. McDougall Hay gave a very interesting talk to all assembled. The Superintendent and teachers spoke briefly of their work and all testified to the joy they had in it.

A union service was held on Sunday at 2.30 p. m. and the three churches, Anglican, Methodist and Presbyterian all joined in the last named church, the children filling the pews in the centre. The Rev. J. W. McDonald assisted the pastor of the Pres. church in the opening exercises, the latter expressing much regret that it was impossible for the Rev. R. S. Fralick of the Methodist church to be present. A splendid address especially for children given by Mrs. C. M. Hinks of the church of the Redeemer, Toronto, was then listened to with intense interest by the grown ups as well as the little folks. Her kindly manner, showing her love for children won the hearts of all, and her impressive stories make a happy ending for children's week. The collection for the day will be sent to aid in the work of the Sick Children's Hospital.
