

The operator sits between the two cows. He works the pump with his feet and places the tentcups, one by one, against the tests; on opening the spigot the suction capidly draws the cups over the teats and the milk begins to flow from both cows toward its destination, the clean milk pail, which is bung out of the way of all dust, dirt, etc. on the spout of the pump.


