The "wet" conditions of which Col. Clarke complained were in the area where the camp was located. The week following Niagara Camp one of the largest Illicit stills yet seized was found at the butts of the old ranges, he points out, and later the night shift employed on the Chippawa Canal was discharged because of the traffic by bootlegge in the dark with these employees of the Hydio Electric Commission.

Col. Clarke declares that so far as the Militia Camp itself was concerned no liquor was sold or taken into it so far as his knowledge goes. On several occasions he and other officers were approached by bootleggers who sought to get liquor into the lines. He states this condition of things made the work of the Commanding Officers difficult and he maintains that a great deal of credit is due to the Officers and men for the manner in which they obeyed

the regulations.

Col. Clarke assured General Williams) that his statement with reference to "Wet" conditions did not refer to the interior of the camp but to the attempts made by those outside to traffic illicitly in liquor. In this particular he maintains the Niagara District was "Wet".
