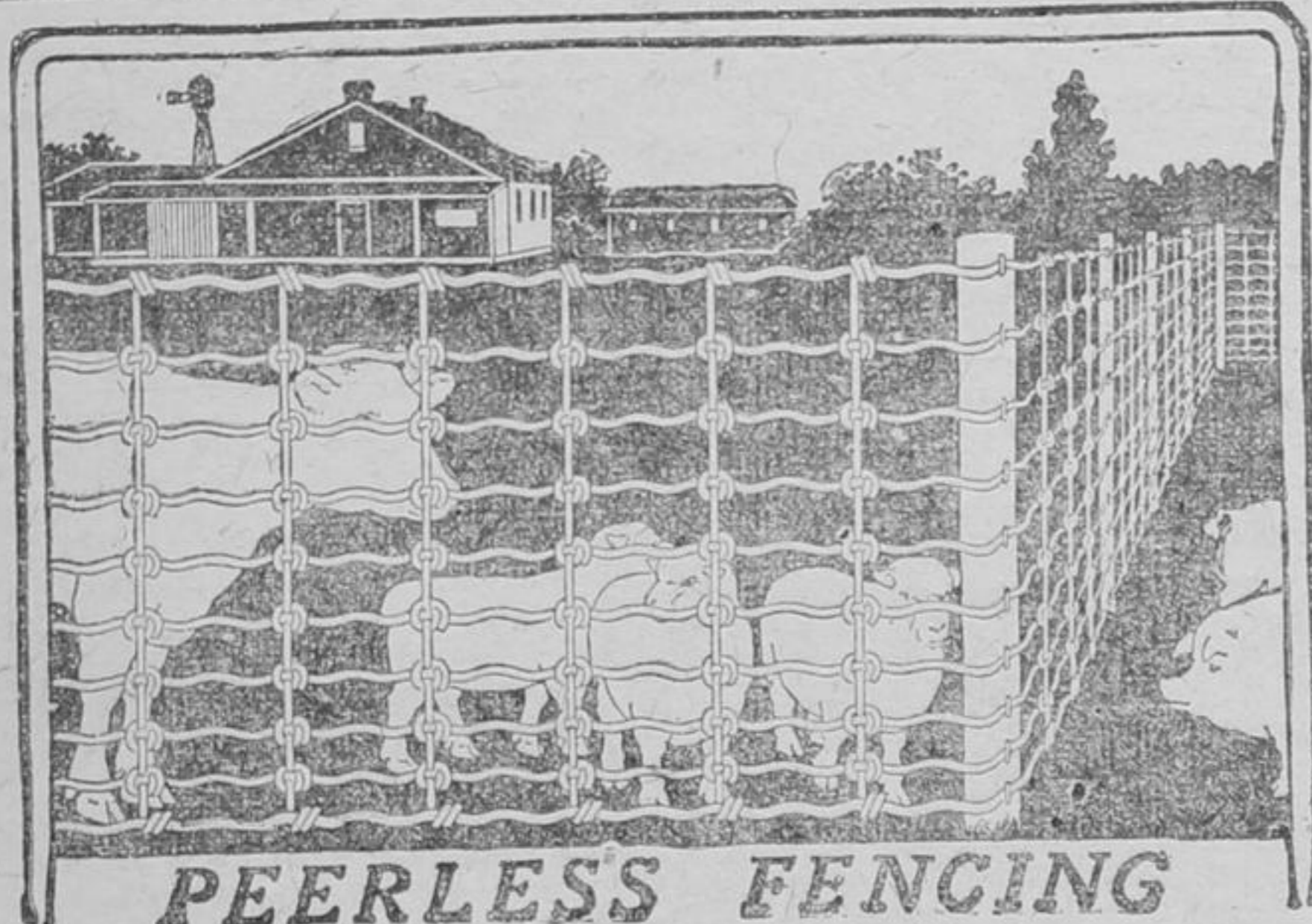
HOME AGAIN
