That day will always be remembered by the present generation as closing a great and cruel war, fought by the almes for right and justice against a powerful nation that had proclaimed to the world that might was right. Have we not reason to give thanks to a Higher Power that justice prevailed.

Mr. Len Wallace, Reeve of Woodbridge, and Warden of York County, does not feel inclined to consent to another Conservative convention for West York. He claims he was tricked once and will not be tricked again, Mr. Wallace will allow the electors to settle the dispute with Mr. Anderson at the polls.

A jury decided that the death of Stanley Showers who was run down by an automobile on the Hamilton highway, was accidental It appears that the driver of the auto turned out to pass another car, and ran into the young man riding a bicycle without lights. It would be a good thing if our law makers would heed the recommendation of the jury that all vehicles be compelled to carry lights after dark. It is always unsafe to drive a vehicle after dark without lights as with the glaring lights of so many cars it is utterly impossible for motorists to detect objects in the dark. The law should endeavor to protect people from committing suicide if the latter will not protect themselves.

Premier Drury is taking a hand in the Federal elections campaign. He joined Hon. T. A. Crerar, Progressive leader, Tuesday evening. and will accompany him in his tour through Ontario the rest of the week.

In last week's issue The Farmers Sun had a front page article which advocates of the "No truck or trade with the Yankees" policy at election times, do not in many cases practice what they preach. That paper gives a long list of names, leading members of the Canadian Manufacturers Association, financial magnates and leaders of the Protectionist Party who urge the common people to buy made-in-Canada goods, but who almost invariably go to the United States firms for their high priced automobiles. Talk is cheap.
