The Conservative Candidates for South and West York

EDITOR "THE LIBERAL"

Had Mr. MacLean and Mr. Anderson, the conservative candidates for South and West York, shown the courage of giving your readers their election ideas as Mr. Macgregor has done I should have wished to state wherein from my standpoint they fell short of the requirements of this election. Doubtless they thought it wiser not to provoke rejoinders but to trust to quiet concession work.

Wishing to have some knowledge of their conception of our political outlook and service, I attended their Thornhill meeting, with your permission I will say a few words regarding their stated views. It is difficult to write interestingly as their programme was so stilted and common places as to offer little opportunity for satisfactory criticism.

Candidate Anderson the first speaker asserted that they would be largely supported by our women voters but the fact that not one of our newly enfranchised class of the electorate were present to welcome and hear them seemed to be a tacit denial of such hopes. Truth to say even the men voters appeared to be very apathetic as there were but 35 persons in the audience which included 3 or 4 of the personal friends who came with the candidates.

Mr. Anderson's election stock in trade so far as exhibited that evening was a very limited and unenlightening character. It consisted largely of eulogistic assertions of his leadership, courage and character with unsupported statements of a very general kind in respect to the effect of the National Policy and of the injury which the Liberal or the farmer's policy of free trade would bring to our country. Even reciprocity in food products would be so serious in its effects that it would ruin our farmers—forgetting that Borden and Meighen gave way to the demand for free trade in wheat and other farm products which while it lasted brought millions of dollars to our farmers.

Mr. MacLean by his appearance and address made me think of a man grown grey in his country's service—he has been in parliament for 29 years—who perhaps has earned and at least has a claim to be released from its further burden.

He told us of how he had spent the day calling upon his old friends in Markham, Richmond Hill and found them most favorable to his re-election. Richmond Hill has become a great greenhouse centre owing to the national policy while the whole of Yonge St. is rapidly building up with a fine productive people from the overflow of the great city at the lake. Right up to Lake Simcoe Yonge St. will become a great highway of our province while Toronto with protected industries and cheap hydro power will be a great city.

Neither candidate thought it worth while to notice the urgent problems of rural depopulation, of immigration to meet the necessities of railway deficits of declining revenue to pay interest upon our national debt, of the high cost of living of labor representation or to make any reconstructive reference to the future of our country. The real issues of the election were side tracked while bold assertions of the return of Mr. Meighen as premier and of their coming personal majorities were too fulsome to be encouraging even to their friends. With the West York conservative mix up to which Mr. Anderson devoted much of his time I have no concern and leave it to others.
