Colden Wedding

Mr. and Mrs. Edward Barker celebrated the 50th anniversary of their wedding at their home on Centre Street Tuesday afternoon and evening. Fifty responded to the invitation, principally relatives, but there were a few old friends who had been neighbors in Markham before the family came to Richmond Hill. A number of beautiful flowers were handed in, and although the invitations said "No Presents," many gold pieces found their way to the bride and groom. After an excellent supper Rev. A. McNeill acted as toast master, and happy speeches congratulating Mr. and Mrs. Barker on their pleasant surroundings were made by Revs. W. R. Barker, N. Wellwood, E. H. Toye and Mr. G. Cowie. Mr. Barker replied in suitable terms thanking the friends on behalf of Mrs. Barker and himself, for their presence and kind words. A most pleasant evening was spent in music and social inter course.

Village Nomination

Mr. A. J. Hume, Village Clerk, took nominations in the Masonic Hall Monday evening, from 7.30 to 8.30, for the position of Reeve, four Councillors and three Public School Trustees, the latter for two years.

The members who held the positions for the present year were the only gentlemen nominated, and at the end of an hour Mr. Hume declared the following elected by acclamation for the year 1922:

Reeve—T. H. Trench.

Councillors—J. Monkman, D. Hill, J. Lunan, N. Batty.

Trustees—G. Cowie, J. H. Innes, G. Duncan.

For the meeting that followed Mr. Hume acted as chairman.

Mr. Trench referred to the heavy expenditure of money during the year, and pointed out that with the exception of about \$800 it was uncontrollable. He felt well satisfied with our water works system which will be completed within the next few weeks. At this point Mr. Pugsley asked if it is the intention of the Council to turn on the water before the Pond is thoroughly cleaned. The Reeve stated that there had been a misunderstanding between the Engineers and the Council relative to clearing away the debris, but with the excellent filtration plant he felt certain we would have as pure water as any in the County.

Mr. J. Lunan was absent through illness, and Mr. J. Monkman was also unable to attend the nomination, but Mr. J. McLean and Mr. W. Wellman spoke in favor of them, and referred to the good work done by both of them as Councillors.

Councillors Hill and Batty afterwards addressed the electors, saying that the members of the Council did not always view things from the same standpoint, but they had all done their best for the good of the Village. They both agreed that the pond be put in good shape before the water is turned on.

Of the three school trustees elected Mr. Geo. Cowie was the only one present. He regretted that so little interest was taken in public affairs, naturally expecting that the Hall would have been crowded at such an important meeting as a nomination. He spoke of the large attendance at the High School, and pointed out that a wing or a new building would be necessary in the near future.

Before separating, a vote of thanks, moved by Mr. Gee, seconded by Mr. McLean, was tendered the Council for the work of the past year.

Also a vote of thanks by Mr. Pugsley and Mr. Cowie was tendered the Clerk and Treasurer for his untiring efforts and courteous treatment to all.

Everybody present enjoyed the entertainment given by the Sunday School scholars in the Methodist Church Wednesday evening of last week. There were recitations, and choruses by the Primary classes, but the crowning feature was the cantata, "The Home-Made Santa." The fairies and imps made a pretty picture, and a neat sum was realized for Richvale Church.
