The 'Save the Children Fund' has quickened our interest in the developments which daily take place in Europe and the East.

A League of Nations Society meeting will it is hoped to be held in Richmond Hill at an early date to place its activities before our people for their information and endorsement. Recent news has come of the return of the Turk to Constantinople and of the replacing under his ruthless control the Armenians of Cilicia and Georgia. The 'Daily Globe' tells us that against this crime there is no Gladstone or Bryce to raise their voice to denounce so great a failure of justice. The conscience of Europe is war-weary and the United States is too pre-occupied with its own affairs—shall we say with disarmament and with Pacific peace treaties—to care what happens in regions where it has nothing to fear and nothing to gain?

Then how about our Canadian people, we have not even 'disarmament and Pacific peace treaties' to excuse our apathy. Two years ago I held the visionary idea that Canada might accept a mandate for Armenia. But we also are too pre-occupied with our own affairs to care what happens to those far distant people. All we give is merely a little money and an academic approval of the League of Nations, all real aggressive influence is lacking in Canadian support. An official of the British Foreign office
