Another Country Club

As a result of the greatly increasing demand for outdoor sports, particularly golf, another club is being organized under the name of the Uplands Golf and Country Club, Limited.

The Uplands Links are located on what is known as the Page Farm, about three miles south of Richmond Hill, below Stop 43. It comprises about 200 acres of rolling land. Near the Club House is a beautiful stretch of water, one of the few remaining ponds on the Don. The trees and greens about this pond combine to make it one of the finest natural parks in the country.

According to the report of Stanley Thompson & Co., Ltd., Architects, the property is admirably suited to the development of a fine turf, and the undulating character of the property permits the building of an interesting course with natural character holes.

Although the main feature of the club is Golf, yet provision is to be made for winter sports as well, such as skating, tobogganing, skiing, snow-shoeing, etc. This should appeal to local residents, for with the rapid growth of the city, this is the only way a permanent sporting resort can be reserved. This is the purpose of a country club—a co-operative ownership and pursuit of out-door sport and recreation. As such, the Uplands Golf and Country Club should receive the support of Richmond Hill and its vicinity.

It is necessary for members to own one share of stock. A limited number of shares are now being offered at \$100 each, one free transfer being given should the owner of the share at any time desire to sell.
