About 4,000 people went through the gates at the Agricultural Grounds on the 24th of May. The weather was ideal, the exhibits in many of the departments were satisfactory, and the 73rd Annual Spring Exhibition may be recorded as another success. The Richmond Hill G. W. V. A. Band gave a good programme during the afternoon, and were congratulated by many lovers of good music.

The Pony Show was an interesting feature, and it would be hard to see anywhere a finer showing of heavy horses and drivers.

The Roman races, hurdle jumping, and bare back riding were enjoyable features, but the younger element missed the more exciting sports, such as baseball, football or lacrosse.

Mr. J. G. Kent, manager of the Toronto National Exhibition opened the Fair with an appropriate address, congratulating President James McLean and his officers and directors on the splendid Fair, which was a feeder of the National Exhibition.
