

NEWS NOTES

A terrific hailstorm swept over Aurora, Thursday afternoon, breaking 300 panes of glass in the match factory, near the G. T. R. station. The greenhouses owned by C. Nesbit were damaged, and fruit trees suffered extensively.

The will of the late Sir John Eaton, who died on the 30th day of March, is being filed for probate. It disposes of an estate of \$13,098,622. Lady Eaton receives \$100,000 a year; also "Ardwold" and the Muskoka residence.

Work is under way in the construction of new greenhouses for Reeve Miller of York township. The greenhouses at Concord when completed will cover 7 acres.

The work of construction on the subway at the Grand Trunk crossing, a mile south of Aurora has been discontinued. Quick sand and fowing springs make it almost impossible to accomplish the construction, and experienced road makers predict that the only solution is an overhead bridge. But wait and see.

The Fielding Budget was sustained by Parliament Tuesday night by a majority of 18. The Drayton amendment was rejected by 120.

It is thought the session of the Dominion Parliament at Ottawa will end in about two weeks.

Toronto Methodist Conference, following the example of other religious bodies in session, passed a resolution giving Attorney General Raney and the Drury Government much credit for their efforts in enforcing the Ontario Temperance Act. When it is known that the liquor interests and their supporters are doing their utmost to discredit the unpleasant task of punishing the law breakers, it is right and proper that Mr. Raney should know that his work is appreciated.

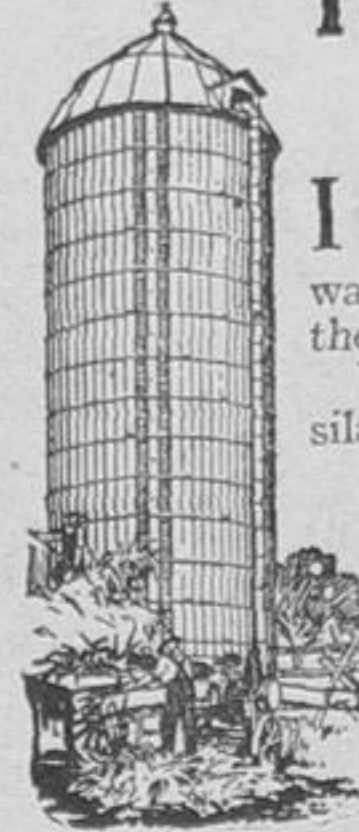

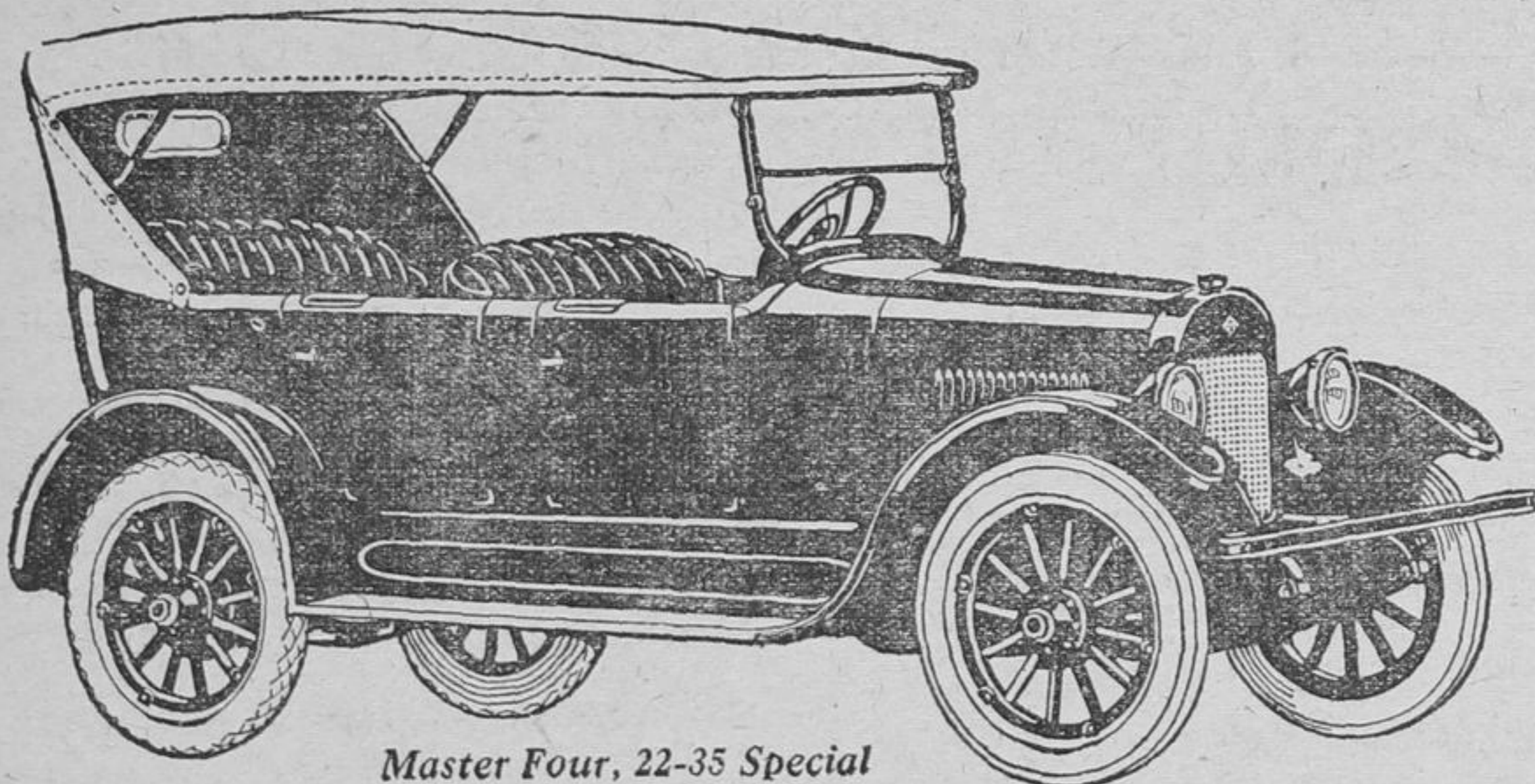
