Mr. Moyle Protests

Sir:—A protest is surely called for from all decent men, most certainly from all christian men and women, over the display of bitter partisanship of a former and of some present leaders of the two old political parties and of the virulent hatred for our Ontario Temperance Act, and of our Attorney-General, who has strenuously endeavoured to enforce its provisions.

During the two and a half years that Mr. Raney has with great difficulty carried the burden of that service, those men not only refused to aid in any way, but deliberately made it more difficult for him to accomplish.

Then at the behest of the Liberty League sympathizers, they vulture like seize upon any small incidental errors that have been inevitable in such a task, distorting them into statements the falsehood of which condemns them as makers, as not merely discreditable members of party politics, but as men who have disgraced themselves by sharing in such dishonorable courses.

That one who for a time filled the high position of a christian minister, should descend so low as to share even a minor part in the course of these outworn politics.

That two of our York county members should have so large a part in these unworthy activities is not to our credit. Even our third member has not been free from the tactics of partisanship that includes him in severely censurable opposition to the enforcement of the act, which he assisted in placing upon our statute book.

If the old Liberal and Conservative parties fail to dissociate themselves from the course of some of their erstwhile leaders they must share the discredit it will bring to them.
