British Columbia Red Cedar Shingles GENERAL RULES OF MANUFACTURE

Color of Wood shall be No Defect XX-6/2-16-

6" or 8" clear butts and better. Random widths, but no shingles narrower than 2". No shingles less than 14" long allowed. When dry 25 courses shall measure not less than 73".

All 16" 6/2 shingtes shall be packed 25/25 courses. Laid 5" to the weather each bundle will cover 314 square feet. XXXXX-5/2-16-

Five butts to measure not less than 2" green. Must be strictly clear, vertical grain, smoothly sawn, and otherwise well manufactured. No sap or shims allowed. Random widths, but no shingles narrower than 3". When dry 20 courses shall measure not less than 74".
