Grading and Packing Rules
—OF—
British Columbia Red Cedar Shingles
GENERAL RULES OF MANUFACTURE

Color of Wood shall be No Defect

XX-6/2-16—
6" or 8" clear butts and better. Random widths, but no shingles narrower than 2". No shingles less than 14" long allowed. When dry 25 courses shall measure not less than 7'.

All 16" 6/2 shingles shall be packed 25/25 courses. Laid 5' to the weather each bundle will cover 31 1/2 square feet.

XXXXX-5/2-16—
Five butts to measure not less than 2' green. Must be strictly clear, vertical grain, smoothly sawn, and otherwise well manufactured. No sap or shims allowed. Random widths, but no shingles narrower than 3". When dry 20 courses shall measure not less than 7'.

Arrangements are completing re the York Ranger Field Day which is to be held the 3rd Wednesday in August at Bond Lake. Lieut. Bert Grant will arrange forthwith the following. The Juvenile Baseball Team will challenge for an Exhibition Game with the Toronto Cadet Corps, the game to be played at Bond Lake in the morning at 11 o'clock. He will also detail a football team to challenge an afternoon game, this team to be picked from the Seniors and Juniors. The hockey jerseys and sweaters will be required for this game. The Senior Cadet Baseball team will challenge for an Exhibition Game with the winners of the York Simcoe League Trophy, this game to be played at 7 p. m. All competing teams must be properly uniformed, as the Minister of Militia will be present and it is expected that the Corps will afterward be reviewed.
