Grading and Packing Rules  
—OF—  
British Columbia Red Cedar Shingles  
GENERAL RULES OF MANUFACTURE

Color of Wood shall be No Defect.

**XX-6/2-16**—  
6" or 8" clear butts and better. Random widths, but no shingles narrower than 2". No shingles less than 14" long allowed. When dry 25 courses shall measure not less than 7 1/2".

All 16" 6/2 shingles shall be packed 25/25 courses. Laid 5" to the weather each bundle will cover 31 1/4 square feet.

**XXXX-5/2-16**—  
Five butts to measure not less than 2" green. Must be strictly clear, vertical grain, smoothly sawn, and otherwise well manufactured. No sap or shims allowed. Random widths, but no shingles narrower than 3". When dry 20 courses shall measure not less than 7 1/2".

**Letter from D. W. Heise**

(Continued)

Saharra, Bhagalpur, Dist. India,  
March 22, 1922

I would like to tell you much about Bombay as it impressed me, but I shall have to forbear. I will say however that we visited the "Tower of Silence", the place where the section known as "Parsee," consign their dead to huge tanks like the Canadian silo, 30 ft. in diameter and perhaps 40 to 50 ft high. In this the dead body is placed on a rack or lattice, and in two hours every vestige of flesh is removed by the scores of huge vultures that I saw sitting on the rim of the tank awaiting their next victims. Once in India one has to acquaint himself with conditions and customs such as he never dreamed before. For instance you engage a Gharrie man, (Hackman) for a stipulated sum per hour, at the conclusion of your requirement of his services you count out to him the amount agreed upon. Does this satisfy him? oh no. But he at once begins to plead in behalf of his own stomach, or some members of his family, and should you weaken to the extent of yielding to his earnest pleadings, this will wet his appetite, and he sticks to you like a Leech, and begs for "Buckshee" (present) until you are tired and in sheer disgust you tear yourself away. But the Gharrie man will follow you for blocks until in despair you exclaim in all seriousness, who shall deliver me from the body of this Blood Sucker?

Such experience as the foregoing, one meets at every turn of the way, and often in between. Leaving Bombay in a first class railway coach compartment, (only such in name) we are soon outside the city limits, and travelling at forty to fifty mile speed through the rice, wheat, flax, and doll lands of India, through a mountain range of nine tunnels in close succession. We speed along on a splendid road bed for part of two days and one night and reach "Raipur", where we are to change for "Dhunitrai", the Mennonite Mission Station. Our expected train, however, has already departed; it is 5 p. m. no other train until morning, we enquire for hotel accommodation, but no such innovation is to be found in Town. But since we already held tickets for Dhunitrai, we were given permission to occupy a compartment on the outgoing train in the morning which lay on a siding. To this we repaired with our baggage and bedding (an essential of a traveler's equipment in India) expecting to enjoy a quiet night's rest, but we had not counted with the permanent inhabitants of a railway compartment in India neither had we reckoned with invaders from the outside who invited, forced their visitation upon us and persisted in singing to us in a tone that always produces in the mind of a perspective sleeper a delirious nightmare. The whole night on this occasion was one of assault and battery. But with all experience the morning dawn found us alive, with this assurance however that our compartment associates during the night, Flees, Bed Bugs and mosquitoes, could not honestly bear testimony of themselves as one of old did say. "I am pure from the blood of all men." Because of very unsettled and disturbed conditions surrounding Dhunitrai, we were advised to proceed at once to Calcutta from there to Saharra where our first Mission Station is located, which advice we acted upon and after two more nights and nearly three days further travel covering approximately one thousand miles we reached Saharra our destination at 8 p. m. on the 18th Feb.
