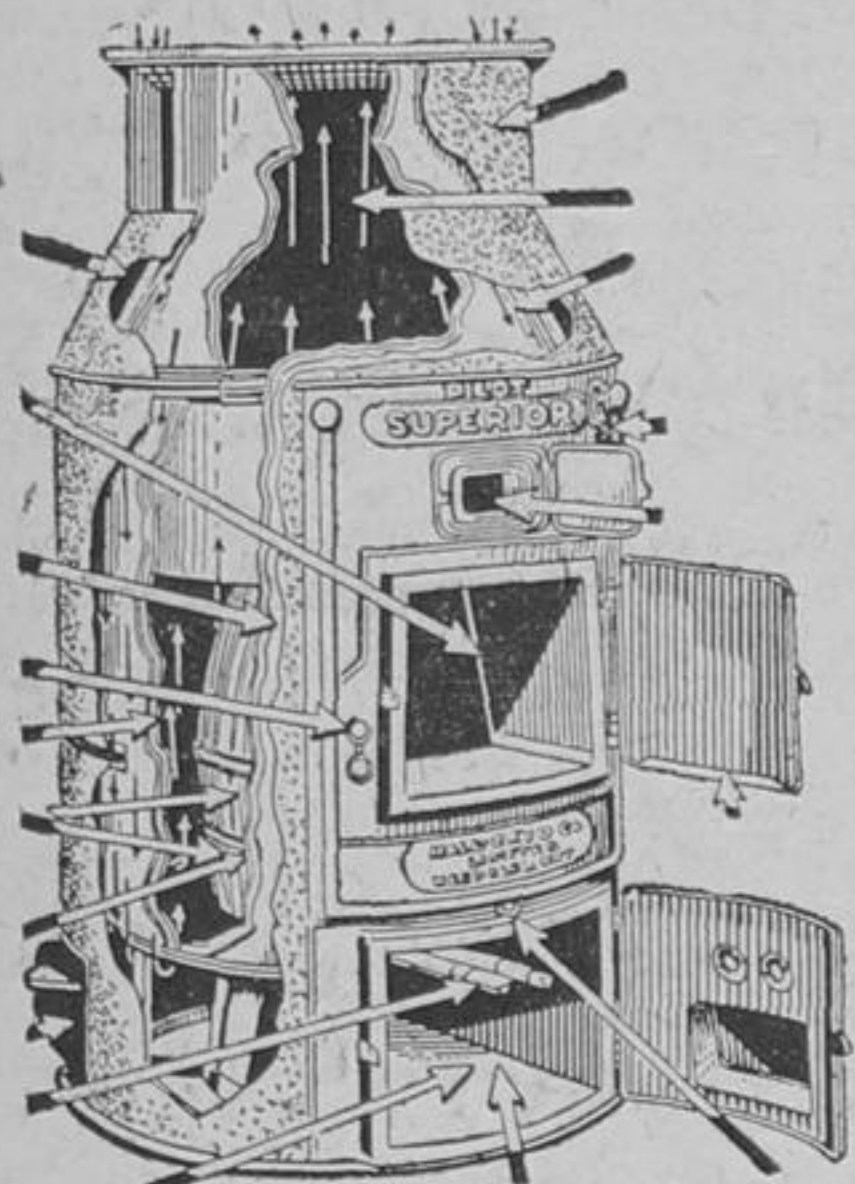

In a public address last week in Kitchener, his birthplace, Prime Minister King in condemning the ultra-modern woman, may not have pleased all his hearers, but his words of warning should cause mothers to ask themselves the question—"Does my daughter do what Mr. King condemns, and if so do I approve of such habits?" In referring to the quality of womanhood Premier King said:

"It is not the girls who smoke cigarets, spend their evenings between the movies and dance halls, any more than it is the women who spend their afternoons at bridge, who make the mothers of men who rise up to call them blessed."

It is no wonder that scores of newspapers throughout the Province have reported the fact that notwithstanding more than a million and a quarter people attended the Canadian National Exhibition in Toronto only one arrest was made, and that for insobriety. The O. T. A. has not completely stamped out the drink evil, but has done wonders in keeping sober those addicted to the habit.

By Royal Proclamation, His Excellency the Governor General of Canada has been pleased to designate the week commencing October 2nd, 1922, as Fire Prevention Week. The object of the period thus set apart for observance, is to reduce the tremendous fire waste of the Dominion, especially that which is directly due to carelessness and avoidable causes. To the furtherance of this purpose, it is recommended that special instruction on the subject of Fire Prevention be given by the teachers, that suitable literature be distributed to the pupils and that fire drills be held in all schools, colleges and educational institutions throughout Canada.

We believe the Globe of Tuesday expresses public opinion when it says: "Hotelmen who contend that beer and wine licenses are necessary to the maintenance of good hotels in towns and villages are wasting their breath. People had a long experience of the barroom hotel and wiped it out because it was more of a public nuisance than a public convenience."

Holders of 1922 Victory Bonds who have decided to exchange their maturing bonds for new bonds carrying the same rate of interest, under the proposals of the Minister Finance, which are now being advertised, would do well to surrender their bonds at once, rather than delay until September 30 approaches. When the bonds were first issued in 1917, the 1922 maturity was a favorite with small investors, many of whom were buying bonds for the first time. Consequently, there are many, many thousands of individual holders and it would be a great help to the banks and the Department of Finance in carrying through the conversion expeditiously, as well as a convenience to the holders themselves, if they would turn their bonds into the banks as early as possible.

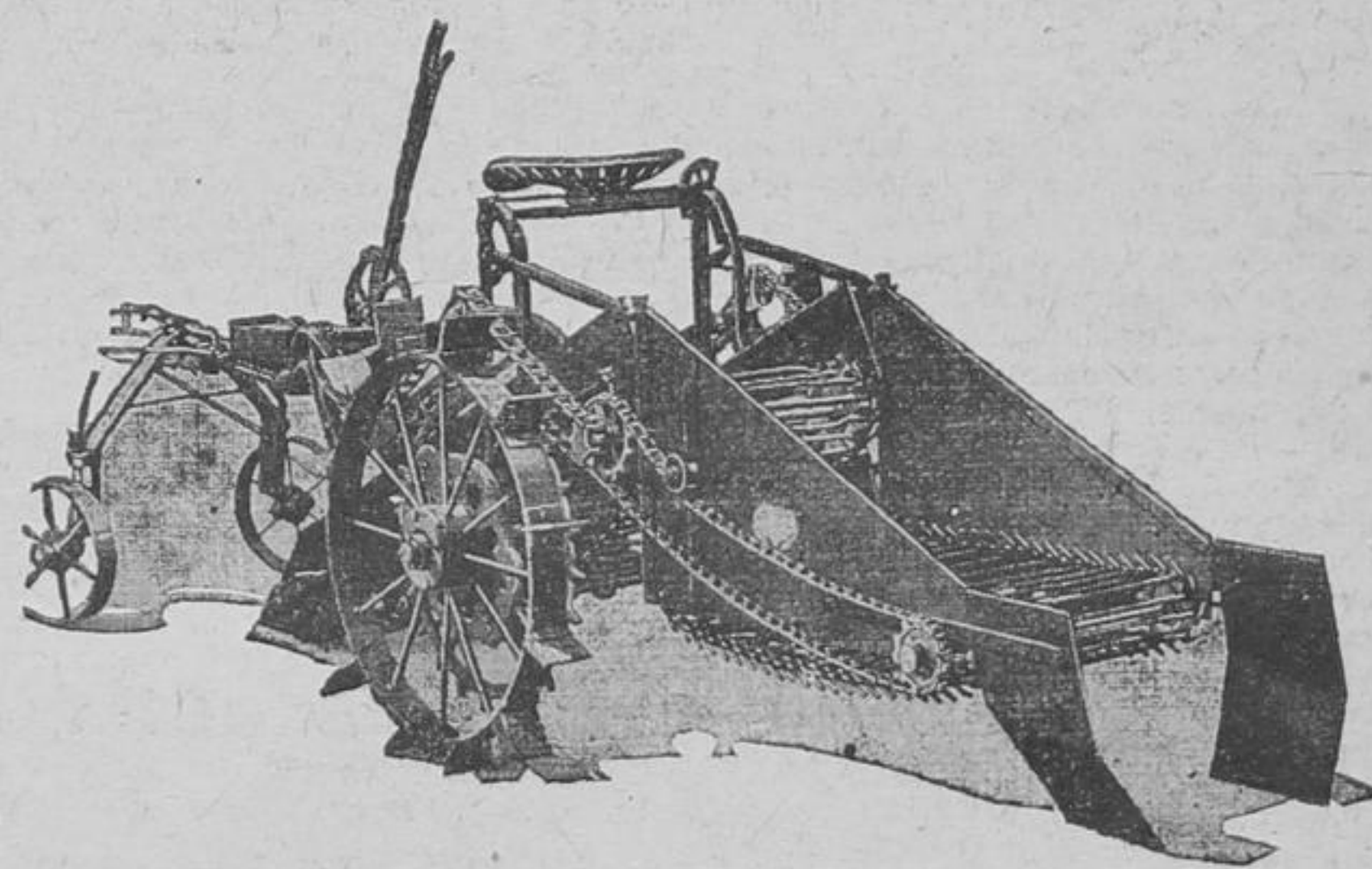
