Recommend No Gun Without a Permit

At the annual meeting of the Game and Fisheries Association at Toronto the other day the following motions were unanimously supported: "That a close season be placed on beaver, otter, martin and fisher for three years; that trapping licenses be granted to British subjects only; that no person be allowed to carry a gun into the bush without taking out a permit, and that permits be issued only to British subjects or bona fide settlers."

After a most enjoyable meal, and a half hour spent in social intercourse, and community singing, the President, Mr. Walker, called the meeting to order, after which an interesting programme was given. Short addresses were given by Rev. Mr. Wellwood, Mr. Plewman, Mr. Fortner, Mr. Hume and Rev. Mr. Warren; vocal solos by Mrs. Page, Miss Smith and Mr. L. Glass; cornet solos by Miss C. Anderson and recitations by Mrs. Britnell and Mr. Price.

Great Liberal Convention

Liberals from all parts of the Province met in Toronto yesterday. Rousing addresses were made by prominent speakers, and a Liberal victory at the General Elections in June was freely predicted. Many of the addresses made it plain that there would be no fusion with the U. F. O. The Drury Government was censured for its failure to bring down a redistribution bill early in the session, and expressed a belief in the principle of representation by population.

The meeting expressed a belief in the principle of representation by population, and recommended the introduction of the single transferable vote in constituencies with more than two candidates, and the introduction of proportional representation in thickly populated urban centres.

In the evening a banquet at King Edward Hotel was attended by hundreds of Liberals who listened to able addresses delivered by F. Wellington Hall, Hon. Ernest Lapointe, Senator Arch McCaughey, Mrs. Carpenter, H. H. De Vart and others.

Old Boys and Girls

Though not largely attended, an important meeting of The Old Boys and Girls Association was held in the Council Chamber Tuesday evening. The membership fee was placed at \$1.00. The sports committee reported that there would be four football teams at the celebration on the 6th and 7th of August. A committee was authorized to purchase a stamp, to be handed our postmaster who will use it on all mail matter passing through the Post Office. The Publicity Committee were requested to issue the membership tickets as soon as convenient. Messrs. Wright, McLean, Greene and Nicholls were asked to interview the four ministers of the local churches, with a view of giving up their evening service on Sunday, the 5th of August, and to join in a Union Service in the Park on that evening.

Messrs. Nicholls, Trench, Greene and Morden were appointed a Finance Committee.

The next meeting will be held in the same place on Tuesday, the 8th of May, and it is hoped a large number of men and women will be present at 8 p.m. sharp. Much work remains to be done.
