A football team has been organized in the village, and has entered the Woodbridge League. It is expected that a game will be played here on Friday evening by the Maple and Elder's Mills teams.

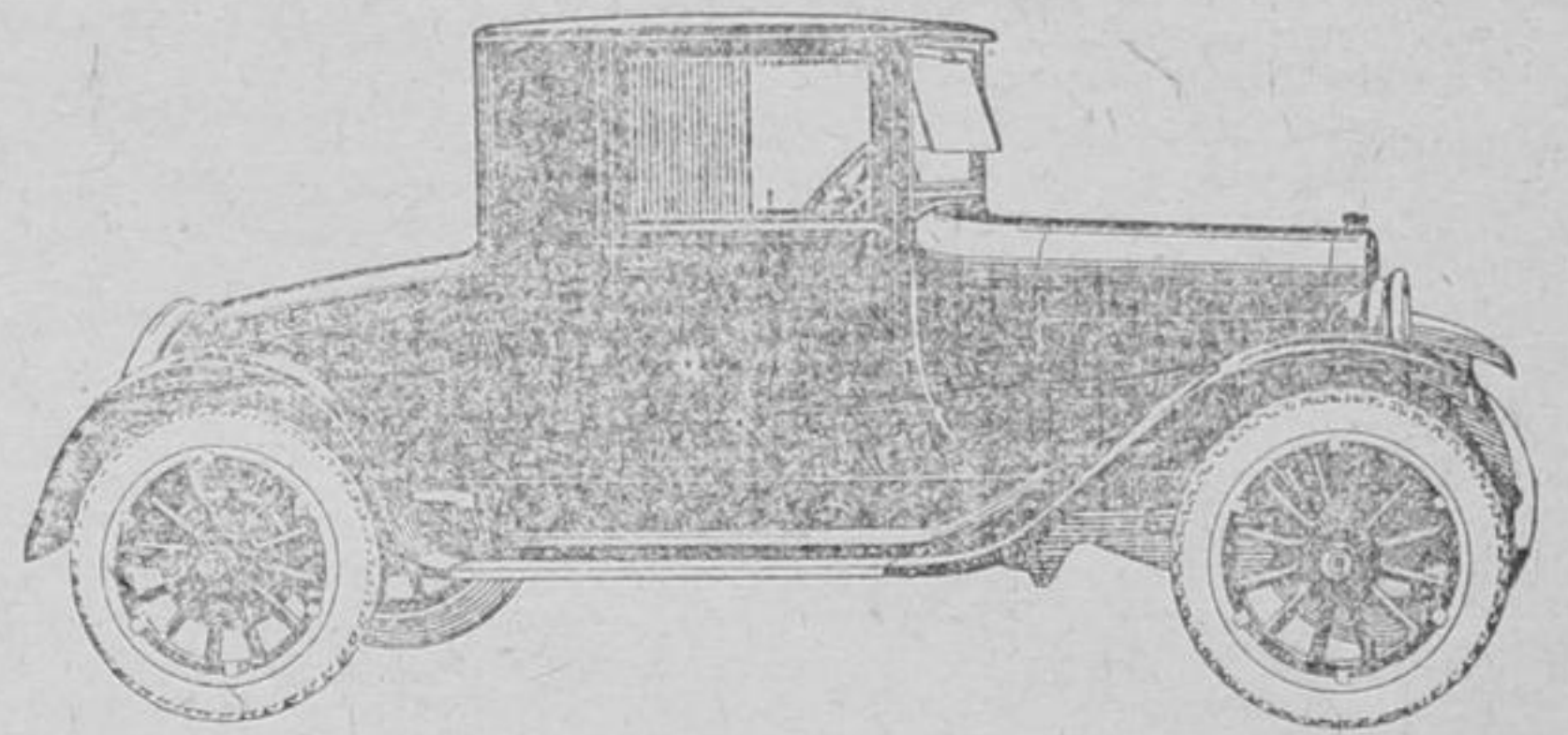
Services appropriate for Mothers' Day were held in the churches and Sunday schools last Sunday. Red and white carnations and other flowers were much in evidence.

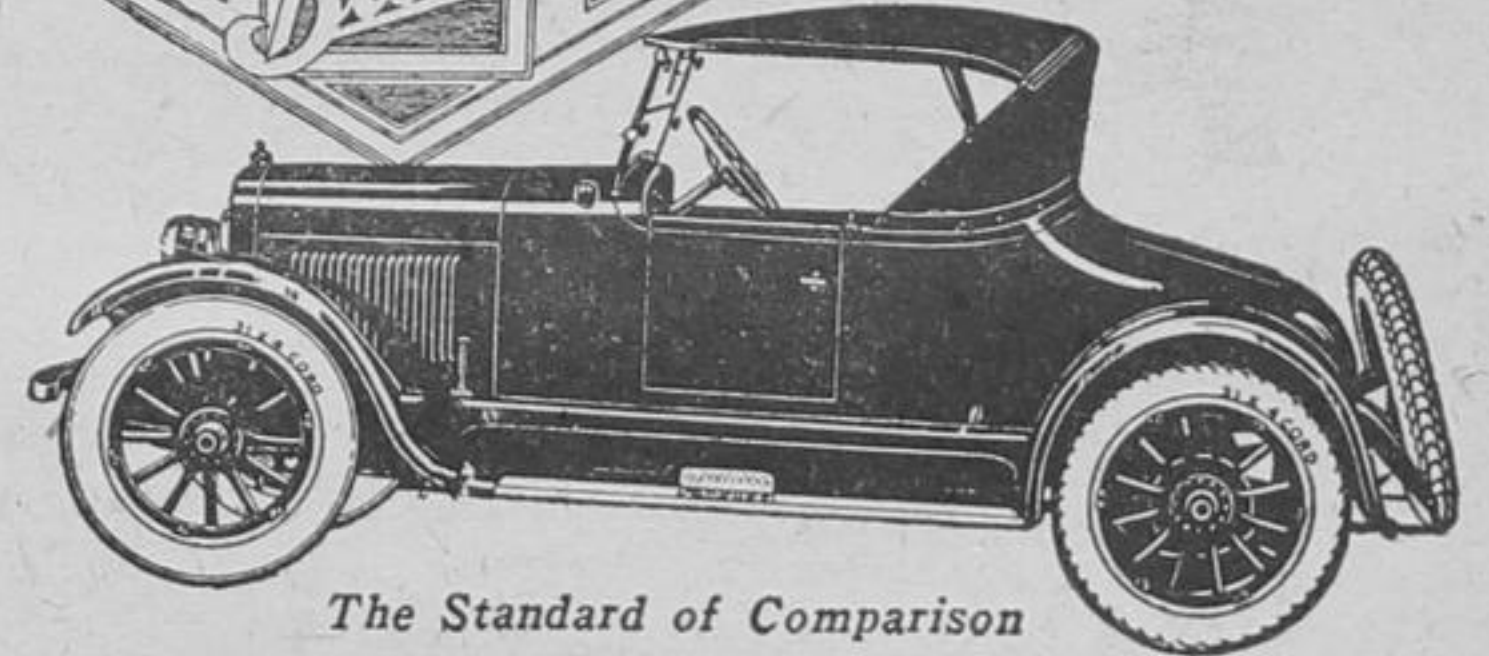
