United We Stand, Divided We Fall!

Although it is denied in some quarters for political purposes, it is generally admitted that The Ontario Temperance Act is, and will be, an issue in the present campaign for the Local House.

That being the case, and with no other particular questions dividing the parties, it seems folly that in many constituencies the temperance people are dividing their forces by nominating men for a three cornered contest.

Hon. E. C. Drury and most of his followers in the U. F. O. ranks are sound on the question. Mr. Hay, Leader of the Liberal party, has also taken his stand in support of the present law; but Hon. G. H. Ferguson, Conservative Leader, has not given the assurance that temperance men and women should desire. Col. Currie, Dr. Godfrey, Mr. Owens and other Lieutenants of Mr. Ferguson are altogether opposed to the O. T. A., and judged by his recent utterances, the Conservative Leader, if entrusted with power, would enforce the Act, he would not be "fanatical," nor

would he "penalize the people" in the enforcement.

If experience proved that liquor laws and laws against gambling, stealing, etc., could be enforced by merely telling men to behave themselves like gentlemen it would be an easy task, but it is idle to talk of such a thing where appetite and the love of money are placed before honour.

Let us repeat, it is folly for the temperance voters—men and women—to divide their forces when the great issue is before them.

As an example take North York: A few weeks ago the Liberals nominated Mr. J. M. Walton, Mayor of Aurora, a gentleman who has spent years of his life, working along temperance lines.

Last Saturday the U. F. O. of that riding chose for their candidate Mr. James Cooper, a farmer of Schomberg who no doubt will subscribe to the temperance plank in the U. F. O. platform. The Conservatives have not yet selected their candidate in that riding, but it is more than likely, whoever he may be, he will win the election on the "wet" ticket.
