## Fatal Motor Accident

Richmond Hill was shocked Monday afternoon upon learning of the tragedy when two of our citizens, Leonard Curtis and Gilbert Ramsay, suffered a terrible accident on Morgan's Hill. The former was instantly killed, and the latter very seriously injured when the car in which they were driving smashed into a south-bound Metropolitan car near the bottom of the hill. The auto, a Ford Sedan, was crumpled and torn to matchwood by the impact. Mr. Curtis was brought to Richmond Hill, and Mr. Ramsay was rushed to the Toronto General Hospital, where he lies in a critical condition.

Provincial Constable Sutton said that the motor, when passing through Lansing, was travelling at a speed of 37 miles an hour. An inquest will be held at Thornhill next Monday evening, when conflicting reports may be cleared up. The deepest sympathy is felt for the mother, the widow, and the three young children in this sad occurrence.
