Richmond Hill was shocked Monday afternoon upon learning of the tragedy when two of our citizens, Leonard Curtis and Gilbert Ramsay, suffered a terrible accident on Morgan's Hill. The former was instantly killed, and the latter very seriously injured when the car in which they were driving tan car near the bottom of the hill. Mr. Curtis was brought to Richmond Hill, and Mr. Ramsay was rushed to the Toronto General Hospital. where he lies in a critical condition.
