GORMLEY

About 5 o'clock Saturday afternoon, during thrashing operations, fire broke out in a large barn belonging to William Smith, farmer, Gormley, and totally destroyed the building within a short time. The fire was first observed at the mouth of the blower of the thrashing machine, and had secured too firm a hold to be extinguished by the twelve men who were working in the stabling beneath the barn. Fortunately, all of Mr. Smith's stock was out in the fields, except three horses, which were rescued in the nick of time by the men. The cause of the fire is unknown. Mr. Smith lost approximately 1,500 bushels of grain, which represents bis whole season's crop, as well as 25 tons of hay. It was found impossible to pull the thrashing machine out of the barn owing to the great heat, and it was also consumed. The machine belonged to Fred Hunt, a well-known local thrasher. The damage to the barn and driving sheds is estimated at \$5,000 and the thrashing machine is valued at \$1,500. There was a small insurance on the buildings and contents, and none on the thrashing machine.
