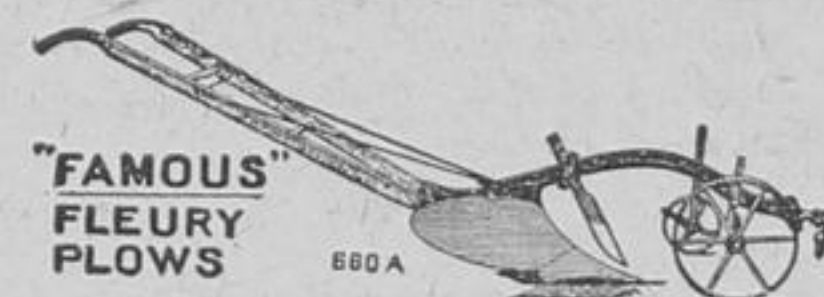

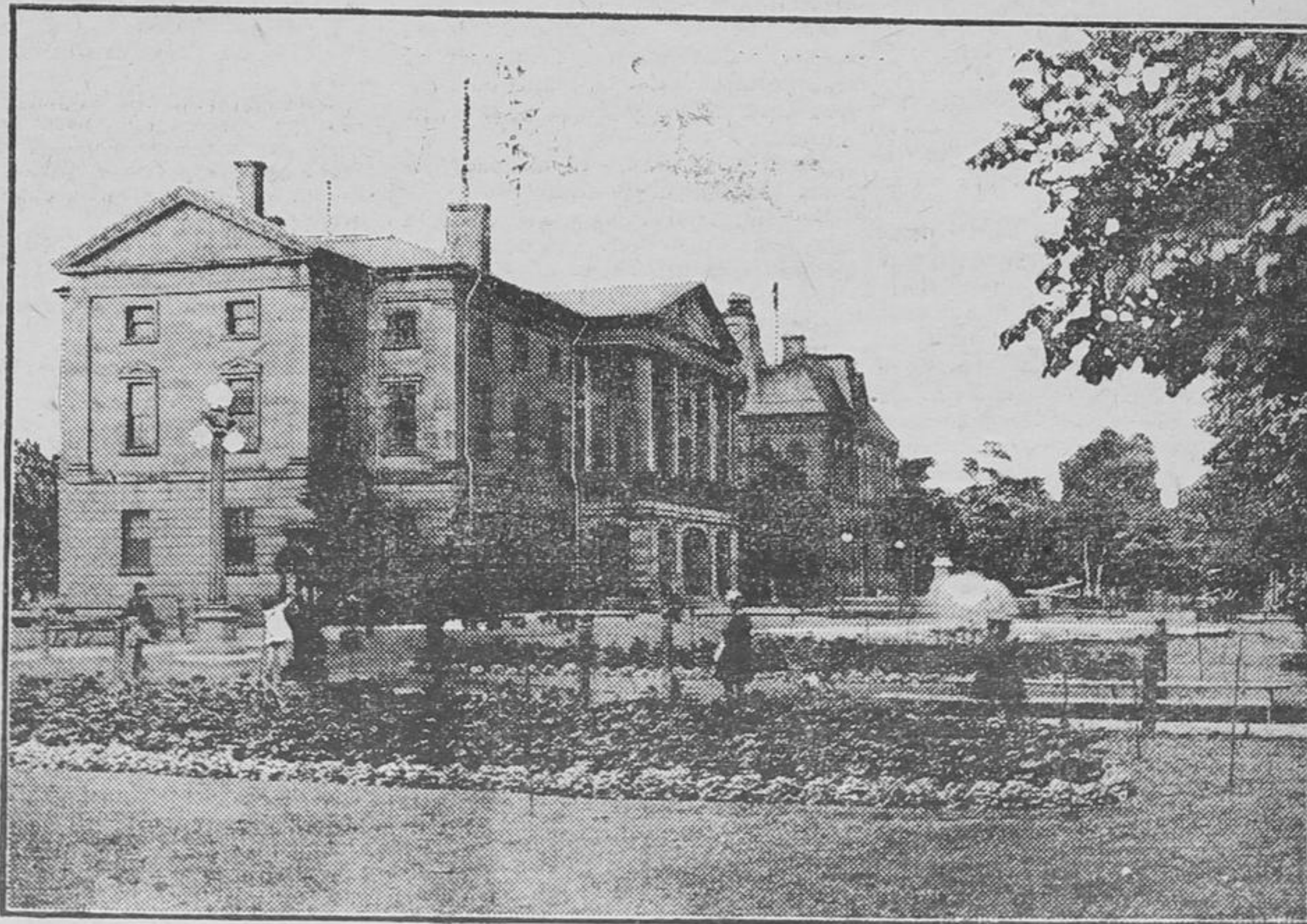

Legislative Halls of Prince Edward Island



The Garden Province of Prince Edward Island has for its capital Charlottetown, a city of wide, tree shaded streets, beautiful parks, splendid public buildings and fine homes. Being situated on the Canadian National Railways and at the junction of three rivers and Hillsborough Bay, it has fine facilities by rail and water for the transportation of the products of its industries. There is about the city a most home-like, attractive appearance. In front of the Legislative Buildings, which are grouped with admirable taste in the park-like heart of the city, there is a large open square, which gives to that portion of the city an old-world atmosphere. Charlottetown was included in the Canadian Weekly Press Association's itinerary over the Canadian National Railways.
