Village Council

At a meeting of the Village Council, on the evening of October 22nd, only two appeals were made against the Assessment. G. H. Cadwell complained that he was wrongly assessed for a building not yet completed. The Council did not change the assessment. Mr. Zafelt complained that he was assessed too highly, but the assessment was sustained. The Assessment Roll was passed.

After the Court of Revision the Council took up general business.

A change was made in the agreement re supply of water for Markham Township. The Reeve and Councillor Lunau were instructed to interview Mr. Sheppard with reference to part of his land on Church and Centre Streets. Mr. Mansbridge was granted permission to remove two trees from the front of his store on Yonge Street.

Mr. S. F. Tyndall asked exemption from waterworks frontage rates on his farm lands fronting on Richmond Street. The request was granted.

The Council was asked to provide additional funds to the amount of \$9,000 to meet the requirements of the Board for the balance of the current year.

The Council was also requested to provide \$100,000 to meet the cost of the new High School building.

A number of accounts were ordered to be paid.

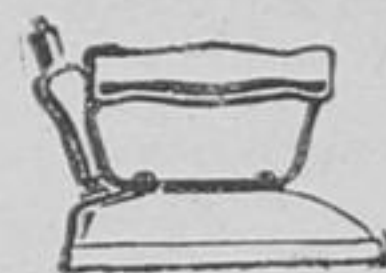
