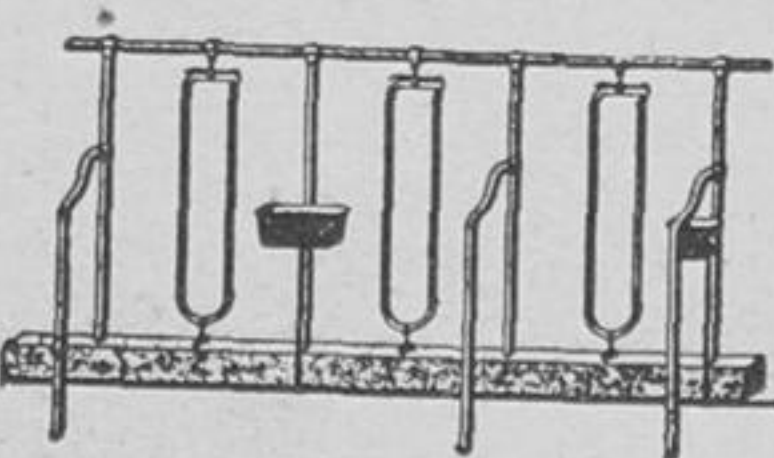
Considerable discussion took place regarding the condition of the village roads, and on motion it was decided to purchase a load of stone from the Wilcox Lake Brick Co.
