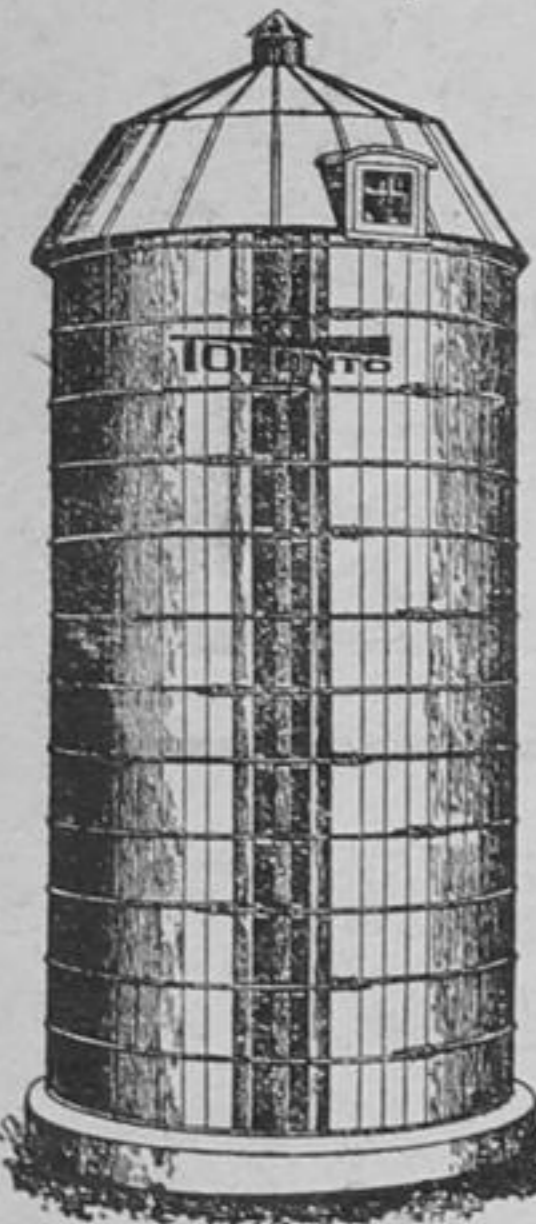

### "Thompson's Bus"

The Toronto Sunday World, in its last issue, gave an account of the old stage-coach service operated by Mr. Thompson 40 years ago, between Richmond Hill and Toronto. As pointed out, the arrival of the four horse stage-coach was an event in those days. The World says: "The driver changed vehicles on the return trip, at his own stables at Thornhill, going on to Richmond Hill—a distance of four miles—with a smaller, two-horse conveyance, and returning in the morning, again to exchange for the larger one. Passengers were picked up all along the route, through the villages of Thornhill, Newton Brook, Willowdale, Hogg's Hollow (York Mills), etc., while calls were made at hotels for refreshment for man and beast. Some of these were: Palmer's, at Richmond Hill; Lemon's at Thornhill; Golden Lion at Lansing; Bay Horse on Yonge st., city, and the terminus, the Clyde, on King St. east."
