BY-LAW NO.

Of the Corporation of the Village of Richmond Hill

By law to authorize the Council of the Village of Richmond Hill, to sell water to individuals or corporations outside of the limits of Richmond Hill, for a term of years not exceeding Twenty years, by resolution of Council passed by all the members present and without the assent of the rate-payers of the Municipality.

WHEREAS application has been received from a corporation outside the limits of Richmond Hill to supply water to a corporation outside of the said limits for a term of Twenty years.

AND WHEREAS contract has been signed by the said applicant and by the said Reeve and Clerk of the Village of Richmond Hill, to supply the said water subject to the ratification of the electors of the Village of Richmond Hill and the said contract is marked as Exhibit "A" to this by-law.

AND WHEREAS it is necessary and expedient to empower the Council of the said Village of Richmond Hill, to enter into contracts for the sale of water without the assent of the electors of the Village.

THEREFORE THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF RICHMOND HILL ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

(1) That the Reeve and Clerk be and they are hereby authorized and instructed to sign the agreement with the Corporation of the Township of Markham, for the supply of water for the term of Twenty years according to the terms and conditions therein provided and to cause the seal of the Corporation to be attached thereto.

(2) That the Council of the Village of Richmond Hill be and they are hereby authorized and empowered to enter into any contract or contracts with individuals or corporations outside of the Village of Richmond Hill for the supply to them of water for a term of years not exceeding Twenty years. And the said Council are hereby authorized and empowered to sign agreement or agreements or contracts for the supply of water without the consent of the electors of the Municipality provided the said Council do by resolution at a meeting specially called for that purpose vote unanimously to supply the said water.

(3) This by-law shall remain in full force and effect until duly repealed by the assent of the electors of the Village of Richmond Hill.

The votes of the electors on the By-law will be taken in the Masonic Hall, Richmond Hill on Monday the 7th day of January 1924, commencing at 9 o'clock in the forenoon and continuing until 5 o'clock in the afternoon and no longer.

Take notice further that Tenants qualified to vote and desiring to do so, must, not later than the Tenth day before the day appointed for taking the vote, deliver to the Village Clerk the Declaration provided for by the Statute in that regard.
