The regular monthly meeting was held in the High School Monday evening. Members present: Dr. Langstaff, (chairman), G. Duncan, Atkinson, F. Atkinson, G. Gee, J. P. Glass, J. A. McCague.

Minutes of previous meetings showed that trustee & H. Duncan was appointed Vice-Chairman; that the matter of advertising for coal for both Public and High school be deferred until later in the season; that the Board are not prepared to purchase a gramophone for the Public school, and that the resignation of Trustee Ramer be accepted.
