## York Holstein Breeders Plan Sale

On Wednesday, May 28th, the York  
County Holstein Breeders will be hold-  
ing a sale of Breeding Stock at Rich-  
mond Hill. Every effort has been  
made to make this a quality sale. The  
inspector, Mr. R. M. Holtby, appointed  
by the Dominion Government, has in-  
spected and approved all the offerings.  
He states, "I have inspected all the  
offerings for the York County  
Breeders Sale, and found the breeders  
willing to contribute good animals and  
try and get away from the common  
plan of putting in what they do not  
want themselves. Only typical females  
under 10 years with sound udders and  
bulls from record dams, were con-  
sidered. A rigid inspection was  
made and in many cases the breeders  
allowed me to select the best in their  
stable. The fifty odd head selected  
are above the average, as to  
individuality and the buyers I am sure  
will appreciate the breed and type of  
the different consignments." The  
Holstein Club, wish it known that  
most of the offerings are from herds in  
accreditation, while some of the bulls  
are from dams with records as high as  
\$4 lbs.
