**BE SURE BEFORE YOU CHANGE**

In an address to the Men's Association of Sherbourne Methodist Church, one evening last week, Sir William Hearst, a former Premier, showed very clearly that it was one thing to pass a temperance measure, but quite another thing to assist in seeing the law enforced.

So many people in the churches and out of the churches listen to stories about citizens drinking out of bottles and buying the booze illegally, that they begin to wonder if the law should be repealed and give place to what they call "government control."

But, the Ex-Premier asked, "How many of these present had studied the benefits of the Act, and knew the number of families saved from poverty and disgrace because of the Act, and the number of homes made happier by the O. T. A.?"

The present temperance Act does not by any means stop all drinking, but it is better and safer than any of the proposed changes.

**A RECORD MAJORITY**

The tariff always has been, and probably always will be, a vexed question in politics. If our citizens were all farmers it would be easy to arrange a tariff that would suit the farmers.

On the other hand, if we were purely a manufacturing people, the task to please the manufacturers would not be difficult. But when farmers, manufacturers, miners, fishermen, lumbermen and other classes have to be reckoned with the work is by no means easy.

The debate on the budget in the House of Commons lasted several weeks, and, judging by the speeches for or against, the man in the street could scarcely form an intelligent opinion as to whether the Robb budget would be carried through successfully, or would suffer defeat.

After an all-night session, however, the party whips were cracked, and the Government's budget was sustained by the highest majority on record—112. Four Liberals and one Progressive voted with the Conservatives, against the Government.

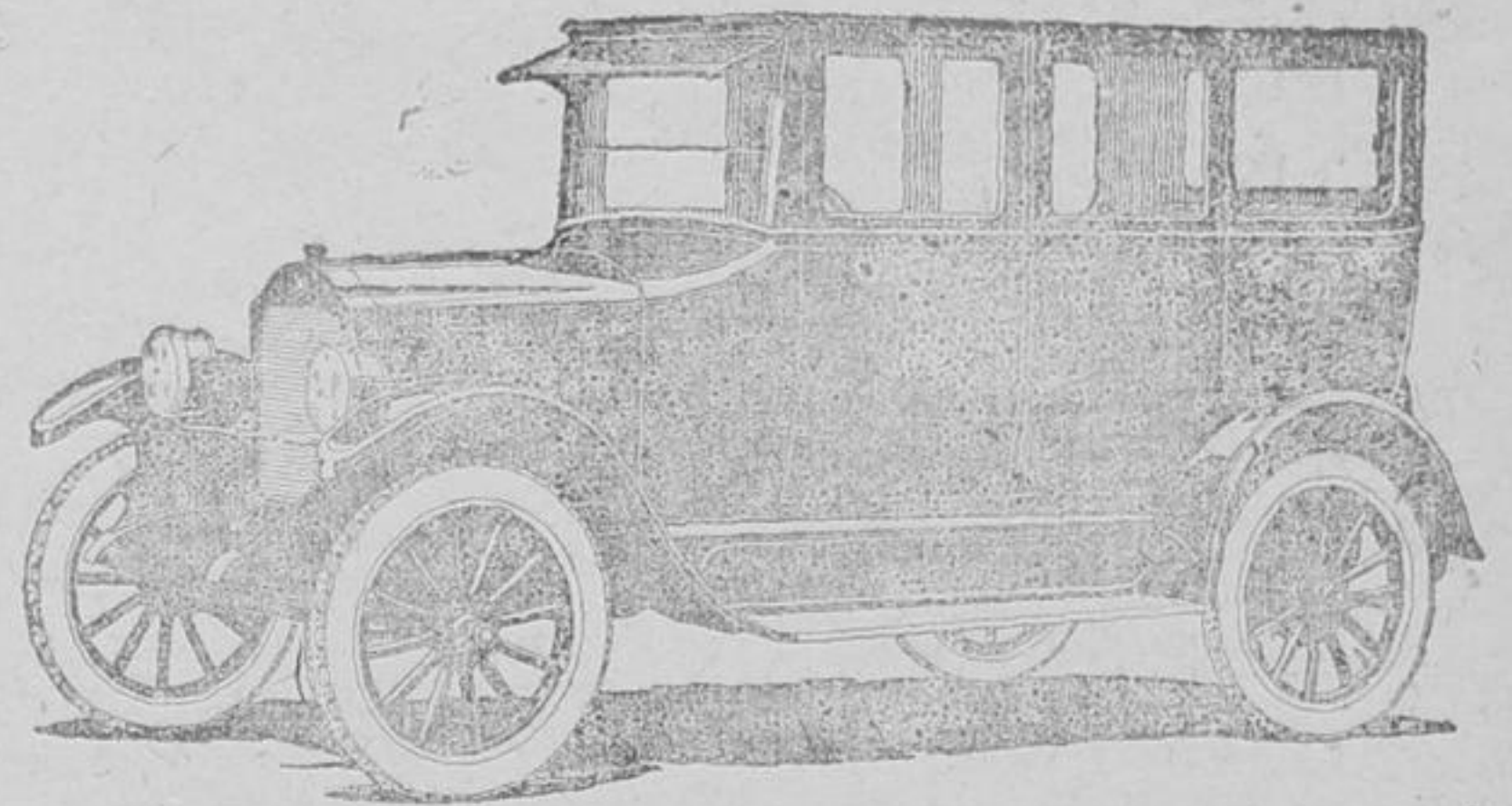

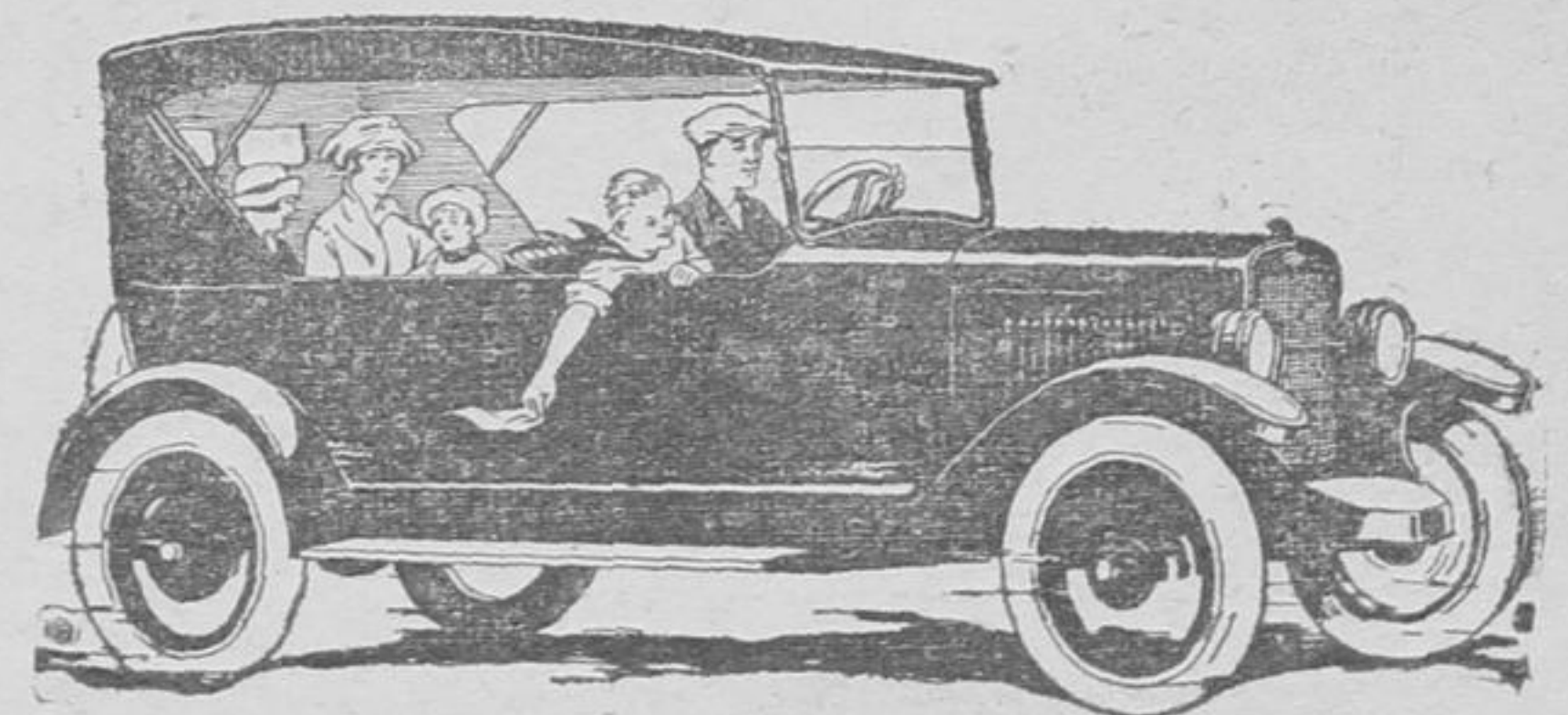
