EASY TRICKS

How Old Are You?



This is an easy method of discovering the age of a friend. For this stunt, however, it is necessary that your friend be older than you. When you understand the trick you will see that a few changes may be made in the method for use if your friend is younger than you.

Subtract your own age from 99. Give this number to your friend and ask him to add his and to it. Ask him to take away the first figure of the total and to add that figure to what remains and to give you the result. Immediately you will tell him his age. All that you have to do is to add your age to the number he gives you.

For example: If you are 17 years old, subtract 17 from 99. That will give you 82. Your friend, who is 20, adds 82 to 20. That will give him 102. Taking away the first figure leaves 02. Adding 1 to that gives 03 or 3. This number he gives you. Add your age to it, 17 plus 3, and you will have 20.


