

Mr. Glover's Death

After an illness of only three days Mr. Edward Glover, for many years a resident of Richmond Hill, passed away Sunday afternoon in his 83rd year, following an attack of pneumonia. Deceased was born in Devonshire, England in 1842, came to Canada when 12 years of age, and lived the rest of his life in Richmond Hill and immediate vicinity. For many years Mr. Glover worked as a stone mason and contractor, and did much work in this section of country.

Besides his widow—whom he had married 60 years ago this month—deceased is survived by Mrs. Frank Robinson, Richmond Hill; Lizzie, Harry and Charles at home, George, Mrs. Lippin, and Beverly, in Toronto; and Jack in California. Also two brothers and a sister—Edwin in the West, George in Toronto, and Mrs. Cawker in Unionville.

The funeral on Tuesday was largely attended, many old friends coming from a distance. The burial service was taken by Rev. H. F. Battersby, and interment took place in the Village cemetery. The remains were carried to their last resting place by three sons, two sons-in-law and a nephew.

Toronto City Council are vigorously opposing the proposed increase in hydro rates, especially in so far as small consumers are concerned. Mrs. McClung, well known in Ontario as a lecturer and authoress; has been living in British Columbia, and has this to say of its much vaunted Government Sale law:

"I have no hesitation in saying that Government Control, as seen here, is worse than the old bar system. Dozens of people in Vancouver have told me they would welcome the return of the bar, in preference to what they have: and they give as reasons: (1)—The women would not frequent the bars as they do the Government Liquor Stores. (2)—It would be easy to get convictions against the men who violate the law under a private sale system; for the Government would have no reason for sheltering them. (3)—There would be more arrests for drunkenness. No business wants to penalize its own customers. The Government being the liquor seller, and the town constable finds the dual capacity confusing.

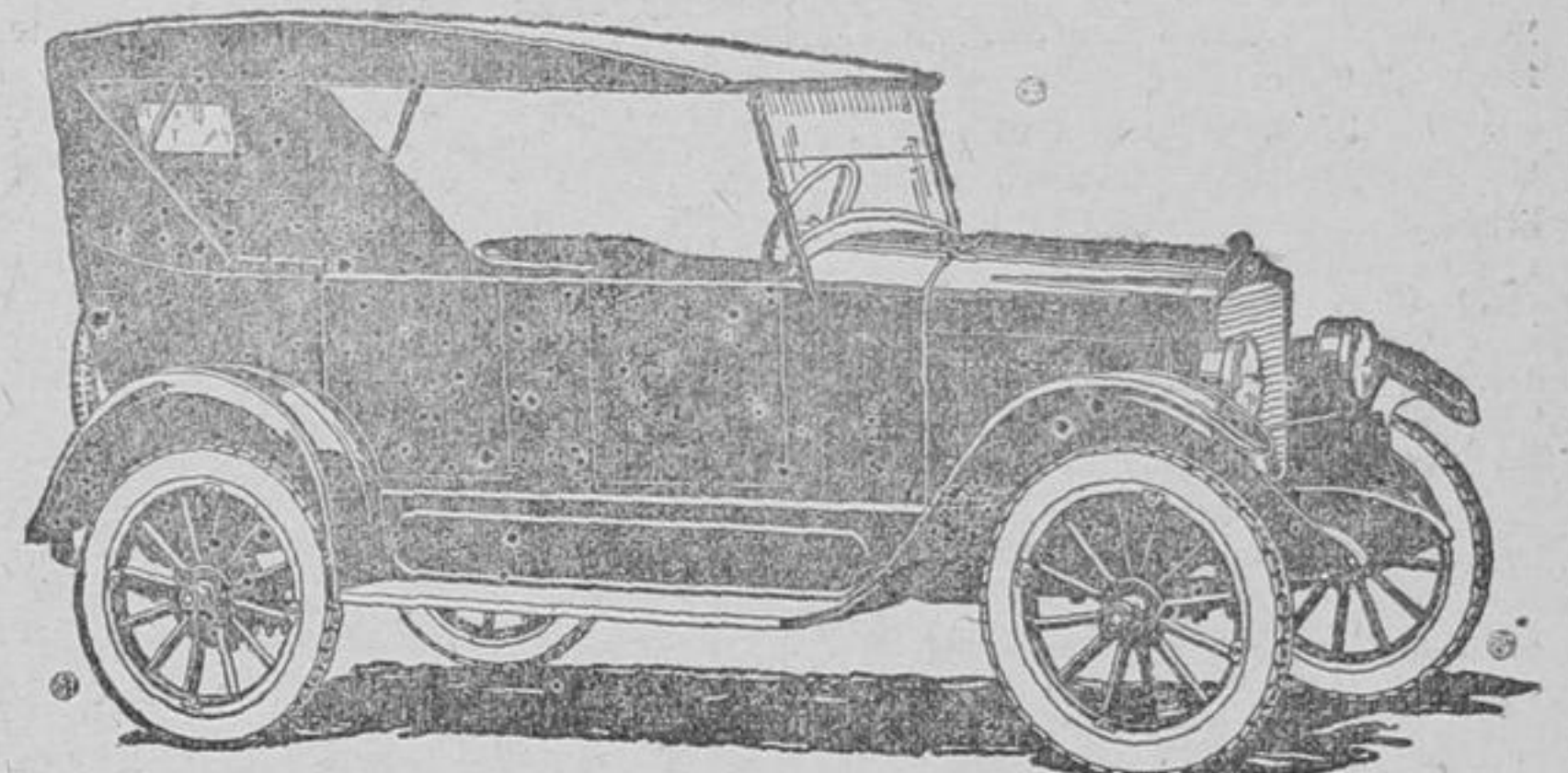

A Pest!

The European Corn Borer

Great damage to corn crops in certain sections of Ontario has been caused in recent years by the European Corn Borer. To check this pest, follow closely recommendations of the Department.



Its Life History

The moth appears about the middle of June and lasts until about the last week in July.

Egg Laying

In this period the female lays its eggs on the undersides of the corn leaves, preferably on the most advanced corn.

The Borer

The damage is done by the borer stage. The "worm" develops from the egg, eating into the stalks and ears. It winters in the stubble or stalks.

The Pupa

The worm changes to the pupa, which in turn develops into the moth about the second week of June or later.
